- Posters should be submitted on tag, poster illustration board or heavy paper. Construction paper may be used but winning entries must be mounted on quality tag poster
- There is no limitation on type of media such as print, crayon, felt pen, etc. used on the poster design but wood, plastic, glass or metal should NOT be part of the poster.

- Collage materials should NOT be used
- Glued on pieces will disqualify the poster
- Poster designs MAY NOT include copyrighted characters, photographs or magazine/newspaper illustrations
- At least part of a yellow school bus must be present on the poster
- Do not put name, school, etc. on the front of the poster, all information should be on the back only.
- Do not laminate the poster
- Do not roll the poster, it must be delivered flat

Criteria for the selection of award winning posters are:

- a. The theme, **# STOP ON RED!** *MUST* be included in the poster design (be sure to include all punctuation).
- b. Relationship of the poster design to the school bus safety practices.
- c. Originality of the poster and how the idea is expressed in the poster design.
- d. Artwork and its execution. A portion of a yellow school bus <u>must</u> be present in the poster.
- e. Visual impact of the poster design.





KUMQUATS

Nutrition Bio:

- Although kumquats taste just like citrus fruits (orange, tangerine, lemons), they are eaten with the peel, which is full of nutrients.
- The fiber in the kumquat peel has tannins, pectin, hemi-cellulose and other factors that are known to help prevent many diseases.
- Beta-carotene gives kumquats their orange color and anti-oxidant properties that help protect against diseases and infections.

We want to know, how do they GROW?





A mature kumquat tree bears several hundred olive-sized, orange color fruits. November to March are ideal growing months for this fruit. Five or six varieties of kumquats grow throughout the world today.

Fun ways to EAT this:

- Eat kumquats as you would eat grapes—with the peel!
- Kumquats taste best if they are gently rolled or squeezed before being eaten
- Slice and add kumquats to a fruit salad
- · Use kumquats in marmalade, preserves or try them candied
- Chop kumquats to make a unique salsa
- Use kumquats in place of orange or lemon in cakes or breads
 Remember food safety: Kumquats should be washed before eaten raw AND before slicing them for a recipe.



Recipe to try as a FAMILY Kumquat Salsa

surriquet ouisa

2 cups chopped sliced kumquats 1/2 cup chopped red onion

1/4 cup chopped fresh cilantro

3 Tbsp olive oil

1/4 teaspoon red pepper flakes Dash of cayenne pepper

Pinch of kosher salt

Optional: 1/2 jalapeno, deseeded and sliced

Directions:

- Combine all ingredients. Add more or less red pepper and cayenne to desired heat.
- Great served with steak or seafood such as shrimp, tilapia, halibut, or salmon. Try it topped on a fish or steak taco!

ASPARAGUS

Nutrition Bio:

- ⇒ Asparagus is loaded with good stuff (including flavor!). This vegetable is a very good source of dietary fiber, protein, vitamins A, C, E, K, B complex vitamins and minerals.
- Folate found in asparagus is needed to make new cells to help tissues grow. This water-soluble vitamin can't be stored in the body, which is why it is important to eat folate-rich foods (like asparagus!) daily.
- Asparagus is a rich source of glutathione that detoxes the body by mopping up carcinogens (factors that causes cell damage) and free radicals (scavengers that damage your body).

We want to know, how do they GROW?





Asparagus crowns are planted

by early spring. It grows into tall branched stems that have fine fern-like green needles making the plant look feathery. Young scaly edible spears emerge from underground roots, which can be ready for harvest by early spring.

Fun ways to EAT this:

- · Try it plain either steamed or boiled
- Blend into soups with broccoli, cheese or potato
- Roast in the oven with parmesan cheese
- Grill on a barbecue with garlic
- Sauté in a stir fry with sesame seeds and soy sauce
- Chop into small pieces and add to pasta dishes
- Mix with eggs and cheese in an omelet, quiche or frittata
- Make asparagus ribbons with a peeler and add to salads Remember food safety: Wash asparagus before you eat it!



Recipe to try as a FAMILY:

Cheesy Asparagus Flatbread Pizza

Ingredients:

- 1 tablespoon canola oil
- 1 garlic clove
- 1/2 pound fresh asparagus trimmed
- 1/2 teaspoon sea salt
- 1/8 teaspoon freshly ground pepper
- 2 whole grain flat breads (naan bread, pita bread, lavash, or cooked pizza crust)
- 1 tablespoon olive oil
- 1/2 cup shredded part-skim mozzarella cheese
- 1/4 cup shaved Parmesan cheese

Optional: pancetta, prosciutto, mushrooms, pesto

Directions

- Preheat the oven to 400 degrees.
- Heat a skillet over medium heat. Add canola oil, asparagus and garlic. Sauté 7-10 minutes until soft, but not soggy. Stir in salt and pepper.
- 3. Lay out flat bread on a cookie sheet.
- 4. Brush flatbreads with the olive oil.
- Top the flatbreads with mozzarella, asparagus and Parmesan cheese.
- Bake flatbread pizzas for about 10 minutes (or until the cheese is melted).
- 7. Enjoy plain or dipped in warm marinara sauce!

FUN FACT: Have you ever seen white asparagus? White asparagus (spargel) is a delicacy in parts of the world (especially Germany) because of its mild flavor and tender bite. Spargel is the same as green asparagus, but grown entirely surrounded by earth without sunlight, which prevents photosynthesis.
