May 22, 2010 Varano's, Wells An Artist Eye: Japan and Sweden

York printmaker, Nancy R. Davison, has been President of the Ogunquit Arts Collaborative-Barn Gallery for over 10 years. At Smith College she majored in studio art and studied printmaking with Leonard Baskin.

Her extensive travel has included not only Japan and Sweden, but also Italy, France, Germany and South Africa. She has sketchbooks filled with quick drawings of people in urban areas and of street scenes as well as of landscapes she will share with us.

Comments Nancy R. Davison, "Travel always gives me a fresh eye and renewed energy for my paintings." Her one-woman exhibitions in Japan and Sweden, in particular, made her aware of the degree to which various cultures value and present the visual arts in different ways. For example, she comments that printmaking, which is considered an art form in the West, is considered to be a craft in Japan.

Last fall, IWCNE member, Johanna Mangion and her husband, Bob, along with another couple, spent three months traveling in China. This adventurous foursome were completely on their own in this expansive country. Making their way via area bus, train, plane, car, foot and staying in hostels presented many challenges to them, including coping with the language. Joanna and Bob will share their experiences along with photographs.

April Meeting

Our speaker for April is multi-talented Marina Forbes, who in addition to her work as a professional folklorist, lecturer, historian and artist conducts cultural tours to Russian and teaches the art form of traditional Russian Icon painting. Her presentation to us will embrace one thousand years of this creative tradition as well as cover highlights of Russia today. Over the years she has been active in many New England organizations including the New Hampshire State Council on the Arts.

Traditional Russian Icon painting is one of the world's important artistic movements. Marina will discuss the spiritual and secular significance of Russian religious art from the 10th century to the present day - a Russian Orthodox tradition passed from generation to generation. Icon painting involves painting specifically stylized religious images on wood; these images are regularly displayed in Russian orthodox churches, monasteries and private homes.. When consecrated they become sacred objects.

Marina will use exhibits including examples of her own work in various stages of completion while she examines the history of this famous tradition. She will also cover some highlights of her 2009 tour to Russia and touch on her plans for the 2010 trip.
