Happy summer to all! I am writing this article having just come back from a week of touring Virginia with Third Practice, performing the Monteverdi Vespers of

1610. As always, the work is a joy in itself, but the experience was made even sweeter by remembering the love and support of this congregation as I prepared the work for my doctoral recital last fall. Once again, I can't help but thank you all.

Throughout the month of July, the lectionary presents difficulties for any planner of liturgy. Our Old Testament readings, week after week, detail the story of David's early kingship. Despite the hallowed image of his rule held by our public consciousness, the stories of David are fraught with sin, repentance, personal tragedy, and renewal. These stories parallel (or, perhaps more aptly, run concurrently with) the New Testament readings of Christ's early ministry. While the comparison between David and Jesus, two of the most important figures in our faith, is important to explore, it can lead to awkward juxtapositions – how does one relate David's dance before the ark to the death of John the Baptist (July 12th), or David's sin with Bathsheba to the multiplication of the loaves and fishes (July 26th)?

Often, our musical offerings will connect smoothly with the sermon; at other points, our song might seek to explore the theological ideas of one narrative, while the preacher pursues another avenue. Either way is a legitimate form of worship, and both allow us to raise our hearts and minds to God. I encourage everyone reading this to review the story of David's rule (contained in 1 & 2 Samuel) at your convenience, as it is probably less familiar to most than Christ's early ministry, and depends more on sequential narrative. In doing so, a congregant can more easily engage with our worship as the stories and music shift in focus and tone. I hope that our words and song are inviting and enlivening during your summer here are FPC!

We have an exciting week ahead of us—making repairs to homes, working in the community garden, serving in the local community, and lots of fun stuff in between. Youth mission trips are much more than physical work and play—they are an amazing opportunity for spiritual transformation—for adults as well as youth! While we serve as Christ's hands and feet in the world, we engage all our senses....

We open our eyes to the world around us - Recognizing need as well as God's presence
We open our ears to the faith stories of others - Listening and learning about God's love
We open our mouths to share the Good News - Sharing how God has worked in our lives
We open our hands to do the work - Showing God's love through service to others
We open our hearts to humanity - Feeling compassion and love for God's children

We have had parents comment that their teenager came home a different person. It is true that mission trip experiences can be profound and life changing! Help us ensure that our youth have these transformative experiences by supporting their mission efforts.

Pray for us - for our safety, productivity, enjoyment, good weather, and that we feel the presence of God.

Supply our needs - We can always use extra tools, safety goggles, work gloves, nail aprons, and SNACKS! There is a drop box in Heritage Hall

We look forward to sharing our experiences with you when we return from our mission. And we sincerely thank you for the opportunity to represent not only our congregation, but the Body of Christ, the larger Christian community, in our mission.

When the FPC Mission Committee announced that the church would be a host site for the Family Homeless Shelter, I applauded that decision and immediately decided that I could spare an hour or so to help. What I didn't plan to do was be the Site Coordinator and yet, here I am.

The first meeting held at the Alan P. Linton Shelter brought together Site Coordinators from other churches and it was where Nick Brown spoke to us of the need to provide a warm and safe overnight place for homeless families in the Frederick community. Nick was honest and fair as he outlined a vision, answered our questions and gave us the opportunity to voice our concerns. Several times I remember thinking, "Tell me again why I volunteered for this?" Then Kathryn Welty, from St. Katherine Drexel Church raised her hand and said, "We would like to partner with FPC", and from then on, I knew we could do it.

In the weeks that followed there were numerous training sessions, phone calls, emails, and schedules to be checked and changed and then checked again, and always, I had so many by my side. Susan Mangold, Kathryn Welty, and Pastor Myers, never let me down, and there were so very many more . . . And finally, it was move-in day and our families arrived. During those first two weeks I tried to be at the Shelter every evening at 6:00 to greet our guests and to make certain the volunteers had arrived, but when we hosted the Shelter again in January, I was able to step back from this as our volunteers had become confident in their roles and were certainly as capable as I was welcoming families to the Shelter.

Joyce Plunkett began signing up the volunteers using an on-line site called, "Sign-Up Genius" which was far more efficient as people from both churches - FPC and St. Katherine Drexel - were able to note time slots which needed to be filled and quickly add their names (Thank you, Joyce). By January, evening meals were being provided and Pat Lloyd became our dinner scheduler, keeping track of who was bringing what and for how many. The families gathered in the Pre-Kindergarten Room, which was temporarily re-named the Hospitality Room. This was where dinners were served, movies were watched, children and volunteers played together, conversations were held and people grew to care for one another. It is where the Shelter Staff, Neil and Courtney and Julie, supported us all.

As I reflect on the year I remember some of the highlights - mothers got jobs, families found housing, babies took first steps - just as I remember some lowlights-sick children, trips to the Emergency Room, distant mothers, dismissals from the Shelter- yet in the end I know it worked. Yes, having the beds and the equipment and the extra refrigerator was, at times, very inconvenient. Being the Site Coordinator took a lot of time and energy and effort, and if there had not been so many dedicated volunteers, I would have turned in my badge long ago, but what we did was important and it needed to be done, and in the end so many of us answered the call with the only response we knew, "Here we are, Lord, here we are."

Since last year, the world has awaited Pope Francis' encyclical, "Laudato Sii" or "Praised Be," but why should we Presbyterians be interested? The reason is that this document, which highlights the last few decades of the Roman Catholic Church's teachings on creation and the environment, also resonates with the positions taken by the PC(USA) General Assembly. The GA's 1990 policy paper, "Restoring Creation for Ecology and Justice" warned of the serious threat arising from buildup of carbon dioxide in the atmosphere. We Presbyterians have been called to care for God's Creation by practicing faithful stewardship. We owe it to the poor, who will be most affected by climate change, to future generations and above all, to God, who created this world.

In Genesis 2:15, we learn that "The LORD God took the man and put him in the Garden of Eden to till it and keep it." Furthermore, the psalmist wrote, "The earth is the Lord's and all that is in it." God calls us to be good stewards of God's creation, not to deplete the God-given resources and despoil the world around us. We are now seeing the effects of humankind's activities on God's creation; isn't it prudent to turn towards a more sustainable future?

Please join us for two Sundays, **July 12th and 19th, at 9:30 am** when David Cassatt, on behalf of the CPJ Committee, will present the encyclical

in the context of the Presbyterian Church's own scriptural call for Creation Care. We will learn answers to the questions: What exactly is the problem? What does the encyclical mean? How does it apply to us? What is the stance of the PC(USA)? What can we do?


