Kenn also found himself falling back into addiction, and it was devastating after having recovered here years ago from depression and dependency in the wake of his wife's sudden death.

"I knew I needed to return to the Rescue Mission to work on my relationship with God—and with myself," he says. "I needed to rebuild my life, my heart, my temper, and my patience. And coming back here," he nods, "I knew I could do it. Because God can turn your life around."

And with his heart once more turned toward the Lord, Kenn made a rapid recovery and soon, "I was allowed to give back here at the Rescue Mission—to serve others, and to serve Him!"

In fact, after working faithfully with our residents, he's been promoted to House Coordinator, "a position the Springfield Rescue Mission has never had before in 123 years!" he smiles proudly.

Yet, Kenn is also humbled at God's grace, "He saw I wanted to change my life, and He changed it! He keeps me safe. Keeps me healthy. Keeps me strong," for himself and for others. "I have so much now," Kenn adds. "But I can do nothing without Him."

Smiling, Kenn looks around at all the holiday preparations at the Rescue Mission and says, "This is from my heart: God has really changed everything here for me since that day after Christmas!"
