Class Descriptions

Wholecloth Quilting with Creative Studio

Tammy Finkler

The class will start with a PowerPoint presentation & trunk show of whole-cloth quilts and samples to give you some ideas. We will talk about materials, batting, thread and supplies as well as choosing patterns and designing a layout for your whole-cloth quilt. We will cover several different methods for creating whole cloth quilts and projects utilizing Creative Studio. Freehand background options will also be demonstrated.

Custom Quilting with Creative Studio

Tammy Finkler

Use Creative Studio to its full potential to do your custom quilting. We will discuss things like thread choices, batting, pattern selection, etc. Afterwards we will work on a custom sampler quilt at the machine using the techniques I use on my customer quilts. Students should be familiar with Creative Studio software. (Note: This is the same custom project that is used in the CS Sampler Set # 388 on my website.) Some of the features in Creative Studio that we will be covering are: Borders & corners/Simple & Advanced; Boundaries & reference boundaries; Placing & adjusting blocks; P2P line & P2P pattern; Trim inside & outside; Recording patterns; and Tips & timesaving ideas, etc.

Advanced Borders Julie Lawson

Borders are fun and wonderful opportunities to display your creativity. In this class we'll discuss different border options and techniques. We'll move onto how to use existing digital pattern sets to create one of a kind border treatments that will help your quilting stand out in a crowd. We'll cover how to make these fun, functional and efficient border treatments work in Creative Studio, and throw in a few tips for making custom border work move along more quickly. This class will include both demonstration and as much hands on work as possible.

New Designs with Fonts

Julie Lawson

Each and everyone of us has access to hundreds, maybe even thousands of free digital patterns on our computers simply waiting for us to discover and stitch them. Come discover how you can browse these patterns, and acquire more of these patterns without spending any money at all. We'll also cover how to use these patterns in Creative Studio using multiple functions - rubber stamp, circular array, and export. This class will include both demonstration and as much hands on work as possible. At class end, each student will walk away with access to several free patterns demonstrated in class!

Why Learning AutoSketch is Still a Good Idea

Kay Oft

Even though the latest version of Creative Studio has incorporated some heavily used features found in AutoSketch, there are still many more features that can be used to increase your quilting capabilities. In this class the three point arc, grid point snap and end point snap will be explained to help in understanding how they work in Creative Studio. We will then go into creating new patterns by tracing clip art or other pictures such as wing ding figures. The students will also learn how easy it is to convert text into patterns using AutoSketch resulting in much more flexibility and better looking text on our quilts. We will demonstrate how to save a newly created pattern in Creative Studio as a DXF and what needs to be done to modify it in AutoSketch. After taking this class, it will become clear why learning how to use AutoSketch is still an important tool we can use to enhance our quilting.

Bring Out The Creative Pattern Designer in You!

Kay Oft

In Version 2 of Creative Studio, we have the tools to create unique pattern designs to use in solving problem areas on our quilts. This course will teach you how to use the new draw tools in Creative Studio along with the Divide Pattern feature to create new patterns. We will go through the steps to separate a design element from a pattern to create a whole new pattern. We will also see how we can combine patterns, create borders and border corners. We will discuss how to insure that they are correctly designed and how to save them. In-class assignments and the time to work on them will be a part of the class to allow for the students to practice these new features. After taking this class, the student will have the skill and confidence to create their own patterns in order to expand their ability to solve problems or unique requirements for the quilts they work on.

All You Wanted to Know about E2E Quilting

Al Hutchins

In this class we will discuss all aspects of using the Edge-to-Edge feature to quilt an entire quilt, or a large area inside a border. We will go through the entire process step by step and explain the importance and reasoning behind each step. Different methods of recovering from missteps will be covered. We will also talk about previewing different patterns, and ways to expand and enhance our creativity with this process. After taking this class, the student will have a better appreciation and understanding of the Edge-to-Edge process and will be able to expand their quilting capabilities.

What is New in Creative Studio?

Al Hutchins

In this class, we'll discuss each of the new features in the latest version of Creative Studio. Version 2.0 is currently the most recent release and will be the basis of this course. If another version is released before the date of this class, that version will be incorporated into the discussion. Each of the new features will be demonstrated, explaining how they work and examples will be given on different ways to use the feature. We will go into depth on features such as dividing patterns, drawing lines and arcs, setting sew order, and reversing start/stop. The student will leave this class with a better understanding of how the features in the latest version of Creative Studio can be effectively used.

Do you have Maintence Questions about your Statler?

Richard Walker

Richard Walker, a Gammill dealer, will be on site each day in the Hospitality Suite to answer your maintenance questions and provide hands on demonstrations on timing, changing tension check springs, and many other maintenance techniques that you can do to keep your machine running at top performance.
