"PLEASING GOD..."

You've heard it said, "You can't please all the people all the time". How true this is! It is interesting how this idea relates to our experience in ministry. We are not to be men-pleasers but God-pleasers in all that we do. One of the most dramatic moments during the ministry of the Lord Jesus Christ is when the Father's Words could be heard from heaven, "... This is my beloved Son in whom I am well pleased..." As God voices His pleasure in His Son we cannot help but be moved at the possibility that God could in some way take pleasure in us. We crave to hear the words "well done thou good and faithful servant." It has blessed me through the years to see the emphasis the Apostle Paul makes of this significant idea. Pleasing God was his greatest desire in life. It was his central aspiration. In II Corinthians 5:9 he wrote, "Therefore we have as our ambition, whether at home or absent, to be pleasing to Him!"

Do we have a sense in our lives of giving pleasure to God? Could He conceivably be laughing with joy with every victory and obedience in our lives? I say, yes! Paul in his many references to pleasing God establishes its parameters. We know that "without faith it is impossible to please God." (Hebrews 11:6) And we also understand "they that are in the flesh cannot please God." (Romans 8:8). So God's pleasure grows though our increased reliance on Him and obedience to Him. We can choose to walk by sight or we can choose to walk by faith. The faith walk is not a result of our independent effort, "for it is God who is at work in you both to will and to do His good pleasure." (Philippians 2:13)

As we go through the process of growth in our Christian walk the bottom line is "God awareness", and a desire to please Him. We are to "try to learn what is pleasing to the Lord" (Ephesians 5:10) and we are obedient... "for this is well pleasing to the Lord" (Colossians

3:20); Paul emphasizes that we have, "received instructions as to how you ought to walk and please God..." (I Thessalonians 4:1); so that we might all "walk in a manner worthy of the Lord, to please Him in all respects." (Colossians 1:10)

In a wonderful way we find the Apostle Paul stating over and over again that for him the highest objective was pleasing God. In I Thessalonians 2:4, he says "so we speak not as pleasing men but God, who examines our hearts." That is to be the ultimate "calling" for all of us. "Oh God, may you find pleasure as you examine the motives and attitudes of my heart!"

The question then arises...but didn't Paul talk about "pleasing all men in all things"? The fact is, the more clearly we see the context of Paul's statement, the more a "God focus" is reinforced. In this passage, (I Corinthians 10:33) Paul is addressing the need for others to be saved. Earlier, (I Corinthians 9:19-25) Paul talked about "becoming all things to all men." A fleshly focus away from God and on pleasing men has the selfish, self-seeking motive of our advance and our betterment. But here a clear motive is explained. Paul is "not seeking my own profit, but the profit of the many." In truth, he is in greatest harmony with God's pleasure when he subjugates his rights and his personal preferences in order to reach out to others for their salvation.

In Romans 15:3 we read that "even Christ did not please Himself." In verse two we are challenged, "...let each of us please His neighbor for his good, to his edification." So in this Paul was not a man-pleaser in the negative sense. His eyes were on his God and his desires are clear...God first, others second (in service, edification and witness) and self last. What blessing is ours as we desire above all else, "to be pleasing to Him!" God bless you as you seek to give pleasure to God. (Hebrews ~Pastor Mark Matychuk 13:16)

We had Marc Johnson come up for the second year to be the speaker of RPG and he did a fantastic job interacting with the students. I noticed that he made the time and effort to meet, greet, learn everyone's name—and then he remember them! He also spoke about how to *Renew* our lives in light of Christ. He challenged the students to stop trying to figure life out themselves and believe in Christ, give up their secrets, give up their past, and trust God to provide all they need in life.

We also had the fantastic opportunity to go to Sand Creek Adventures. All of us got to go work on teamwork in the low ropes as well as go down on the zip lines. Some of the really brave students took it

to the high ropes course and challenged themselves to do more than they thought they could.

Out of the original 70 students about 55 remained for a three day missions trip after the Family Bible Conference concluded. The mission trip focused on helping others since they had just been poured into during the conference. They did a bunch of yard work on Sunday afternoon for some of our own church members as well as for some of the community that is right around Bethesda. On Monday and Tuesday they headed out to two organizations to help remodel and paint—and these projects were not push overs. They worked hard!



Thought for the Month Summer is fleeting! Wake up every day as happy as a cat with two tails!!!


GGF Family Bible Conference




Pacesetters Stillwater River Cruise
