Tattoo bully, victim on Dr. Phil

Lewd phrase was drawn on boy

The Concord tattooing bully and bullied didn't quite come face-to-face yesterday when they appeared, parents in tow, on the nationally syndicated television show of Dr. Phil McGraw.

A court order prevented Blake Vannest, 18, from speaking directly with Zach Austin, 15, or his parents, explained McGraw, the self-help talk show host, and so Vannest spoke through McGraw to apologize for his part in tattooing a lewd phrase on the buttocks of the younger boy.

"I would like to apologize to Zach," Vannest said to McGraw as the Austins watched on television from another room. McGraw asked why.

"Because it's a ridiculous, stupid thing I did," Vannest said. "It was wrong. It shouldn't have happened."

The Concord families appeared yesterday on a segment devoted to bullies and their parents. Vannest and three other men were

convicted of charges stemming from a May 10 incident when the police said they bullied Zach into letting them apply the tattoo.


Vannest said on the show that he was freed Nov. 11 after serving four months in jail. Ryan Fisk, Donald Wyman and Travis Johnston were also sentenced to jail time in connection with the event. The police said at the time that a 15-year-old could face charges in juvenile court.


In footage taped before the show, Michael and Tammy Austin described how they felt after hearing what their son had endured in the basement of a Concord home.

"When I heard about the tattoo, I felt just a rage that was inside of me," Michael Austin said.

"And to be honest with you, if I had known where these kids lived at that time, I may have gone to their house and tattooed those guys.

"How could they do this to my son? Even once this tattoo is removed, he's still going to be the kid for the rest of his life that had the tattoo on his rear end."

Zach Austin described his response to the tattooing. "It kind of made me feel sick, and I felt really bad about myself," he said.

In her own pre-show interview, Patti Vannest, Blake's mother, said the tattooing had been a joke. She maintained that Zach had wanted the tattoo and said the news media had failed to tell the whole story.

"After this tattoo was done, Blake prepared it, put ointment on it and drove this boy back to school in my car," she said. "I find it hard to believe that if you're bullying somebody that you're going to give them a ride in your car."

During the show, McGraw challenged her claims and suggested she was portraying her son as the victim.

"Here's what we do know," McGraw said. "We do know this is a younger boy. We do know it was a 4-to-1 ratio, and these four boys took him to a basement, isolated somewhere. And is there any question that they in fact took a tattoo gun and wrote 'poop d---' on his rear end?"

"They did that," Patti Vannest said.

"Then what difference does it make what the peripheral circumstances about it are?" McGraw said

Later, Patti Vannest said she felt pushed to defend her son in part because she had received death threats. Otherwise, she would focus on helping her family and the Austins, she said.

"If my life wasn't being threatened from people all over the country, I don't think I would be defending any of it," she said. "I don't think I would address it beyond what's going on in my house and what I could do to make their lives better."

She told McGraw she agreed her son should be punished for his crime, which she described as horrible and disgusting.

Finally, Blake Vannest appeared, saying he wanted to tell his side of the story. He said he did not deny doing anything wrong, but he said the story that was told about him was not truthful. (next page »)

"The media took it and made it something it wasn't," Vannest said. "I got kicked out of my mom's house, kicked out of school. I don't see why the school threw me out."

McGraw asked Vannest if he knew Zach was younger and didn't have many friends. Vannest said he did.

"So did it occur to you he was doing this in order to get acceptance from you all?" McGraw said.

"Not until after the fact, no." Vannest said. "After it happened, yes."

Molly McKean, an attorney representing the Austins, said the family appeared on Dr. Phil to raise awareness of bullying and show that their son should not be ashamed that he was bullied.

"The more people that hear about bullying and talk about bullying, the more people might say something to their kid or notice something going on," McKean said.





McKean said the Austins are considering suing the Concord School District for negligence. She declined to say where Zach now attends school.

Jonathan Cohen, an attorney representing Vannest, said the segment was accurate and fair. But he said the case was too complex to be portrayed fully during the program.


