RESTORATIVE PRACTICE PARENT WORKSHOPS

Thank you to approximately 45 parents who attended the Restorative Practice parent workshops on Wednesday last week. It was a great opportunity to find out more about this whole-school program.

THE SCHOOL DAY STARTS AT 9:15AM

It is a **legal** requirement that school-age children are present at their school of enrolment during the hours of operation of that school. Our school day commences at 9:15am, and students must be here by that time to commence their lessons. Thank you for your support.

BIKES AND SCOOTERS

We welcome students cycling and/or scooting safely to school, with parent permission (in writing, including email). Extract from "Student Travel to and from School" Policy:

<u>Students in Years 1-6 are permitted to ride bicycles and scooters to school with the permission of their parents/carers.</u> Parents/carers are required to inform the Deputy Principal, Student Welfare, in writing if their child is going to ride to school.

The conditions under which the school expects a student to ride a bicycle or scooter to school are:

- the student rides safely to and from school
- the student wears a helmet while riding the bicycle or scooter
- the student does not ride the bicycle or scooter in the school grounds and
- the student provides a chain and padlock to secure the bicycle to the student bike rack outside the school office during school hours, or arranges with their class teacher an appropriate place to store the scooter during school hours.

The school does not accept any responsibility for the care of the bicycle or scooter or associated equipment during the school day.

CHANGE OF ROUTINE

We encourage all families to have a plan whereby changes to end-of-day pick-up routines can be communicated effectively and arrangements for a 'Plan B' are in place (eg: a late pick-up or a change to an after-school activity). This may include attending an after-school care provider or going to a friend's house. This can prevent a lot of worry when occasionally things change.

REMINDERS

SCHOOL PHOTOS

Our photo days are coming up – Monday 17th March for classes (main day) and Monday 31st March for other groups. On the main day all class photos and family/individual portrait photos will be taken. Weather permitting, we also take the Year 6 group photo. On the second day the other group photos (eg: band, orchestra, library monitors) will be taken. The prefect photo will be taken on 17th March because the prefects are out of the school on the 31st.

All orders and payments for class, individual and family photos are to be given to the photographers on the day. NO MONEY OR ORDERS ARE TO BE HANDED TO CLASS TEACHERS OR TO THE OFFICE AT ANY TIME. Spare order forms are available from the office. Family (sibling) photo order forms are available from the office.

The office will not be able to give change on photo day and will not be able to phone home on photo day for students who do not have an order form. Late orders can be made through the photography company and may incur a late fee.

THE PREMIER'S READING CHALLENGE

The SHPS library staff continues to promote the NSW Premier's Reading Challenge (PRC) as a great way to extend children's reading skills and expose them to a 'smorgasbord' of classic writing for children.

PRC titles in the K-2 (marked with a Pink Star) and Y3-4 (marked with a Yellow Star) sections of the PRC are located separately in the school library for ease of selection.

Students in Years 5 and 6 can locate NSW Premier's Reading Challenge titles held in our library collection by using the 'Reading Lists' section of our school library catalogue 'My Library'.

Once read, the title should be recorded into the student's reading record online at: www.schools.nsw.edu.au/premiersreadingchallenge

Children can log on to the PRC website using the same username and password they use to access the Kid Space Portal.

*Please note that the library computer system does not record your child's loan history so it is important to record each title your child reads before returning it to the library!

OPERATION ART 2014

Summer Hill Public School has been invited to participate in Operation Art which is an initiative of the Children's Hospital at Westmead and the NSW Department of Education and Communities. This program provides a forum for schools and students to display their visual arts achievements through exhibitions at the Armoury Gallery Sydney Olympic Park and the Art Gallery of NSW.

Last year a painting by Max G (5GB), was chosen as a winner. It is currently part of an exhibition that is being shown in regional galleries across NSW. Eventually it will be hung in a hospital to help brighten up the wards.

Each participating school may submit up to four pieces of work by any student from Kindergarten to Year 6. All the pieces submitted by our students will be judged by a totally independent art expert from The Royal Art Society of



NSW who will decide on the four pieces which will represent our school. The theme of the work must be something cheerful and uplifting that is appropriate for display in a hospital.

The piece of work can range in size from a minimum A4 (30 x 21cm) to a maximum A2 (42×60 cm) and a maximum depth of 5mm.

Paintings do not need to be framed. Winning entries will be professionally framed and exhibited at the Armory Gallery in Olympic Park.

The closing date for submissions is Friday IIth April 2014.
