### Conservation & Legislation

### OSA Supports Re-compression Field Studies

Five members of our club supported the Sport fishing Association of California (SAC) and NOAA Southwest Fisheries Division on three, half day trips testing five decending devices used for recompressing rockfish. (See video on website conservation page to gain info on recompression and extended report on this event.)
OSA was invited by *Ken Franke*, President of SAC to participate in the field study conducted south of La Jolla in depths up to 300 ft. Ken

OSA was invited by Ken Franke, President of SAC to participate in the field study conducted south of La Jolla in depths up to 300 ft. Ken Franke's sport boat, the Outerlimits was used during the field tests. Supporting the efforts was Fisheries Scientists from NOAA, a photographer documenting the release and several support staff from SAC. All fish caught were released back into the ocean using the decending devices. Depth of release varied between 100-150 feet or the bottom using the different descending devices. OSA members completed a survey that will be used to evaluate the effectiveness of the devices, ease of use and ability to purchase devices based on price. During the 2013 rockfish season club members utilized one such decending tool while fishing from local sport boats with varied results. Our situation is not uncommon for most sport boats fisherman as the freeboard can exceed 3 ft. This height present challenges with some of the devices. The devices must be easy to use and not present a safety issue during the release or storage. Members of the test teams were given a free release device, which will be incorporated into the 2014 charter masters kit used on all rock cod and shallow water inshore trips. Our hope is to have enough feedback to standardize on a safe and easy release method by the end of the 2014 season.


OSA anglers actively engage in CPR with Calico and Sand Bass. (Catch – Photograph – Release).




