If you have a child born in 2011 STARTING KINDERGARTEN OR going into GRADE 8 in September 2016, please see the next page for important information.

FEBRUARY IS REGISTRATION MONTH

- February is registration month for children born in 2011 for Kindergarten starting in September 2016.
- All forms, procedures and a list of required documents can be downloaded from the Burnaby School District website www.burnabyschools.ca. A list of required documents is included below to assist you.
- For ALL registrations please bring original documents for photocopying. You do not need to make an appointment, but we will only be accepting registrations from 9:30 12:00 and 1:00 3:00 p.m. each day.

CROSS DISTRICT, OUT-OF-DISTRICT AND DISTRICT LANGUAGE PROGRAM APPLICATIONS:

- If you do not live in our catchment area and applying to attend Montecito School, you MUST FIRST REGISTER at your attendance area (catchment) school. A CROSS-DISTRICT application form must accompany the registration form and MUST be signed by the school principal at your catchment school. The catchment area school will then forward the applicable form(s) to the other appropriate school(s).
- Students living outside of Burnaby can apply to attend a Burnaby school by submitting an OUT-OF-DISTRICT form.
- All CROSS-DISTRICT and OUT-OF-DISTRICT applications submitted on time will be reviewed by the school district and you will be notified of their decision by March 31. Applications submitted within the established timelines (Feb. 2 29) are considered first.
- District Language Program Applications -please visit www.burnabyschools.ca for information regarding District Language Program Options all forms and procedures are available there.

STUDENTS GOING INTO GRADE 8

• Current Grade 7 district students will automatically be registered for Grade 8 at the secondary school within the designated attendance area where the student resides within Burnaby. Current Grade 7 students who do not reside in the attendance area for the secondary school they wish to attend must submit a Cross-district or Out-of-district Transfer Application in order to be considered for admission to that secondary school. All forms and procedures can be downloaded from the Burnaby School District website www.burnabyschools.ca.

BURNABY SCHOOL DISTRICT REGISTRATION PROCEDURES: Contact the school that serves the attendance area in which you reside. Students must reside with their parents or legal guardian. Parents or guardians must accompany their child for registration and bring the following original documentation:

- 1. **Proof of birth date for the student** (birth certificate or passport)
- 2. **Proof of guardianship** (parents' or guardians' as shown on birth certificate or other appropriate legal documentation such as landed immigrant paper or guardianship order). Note that a notarized custodial guardian appointment is not the same as a guardianship order granted by the courts.
- 3. **Proof of citizenship for both the parent and the student** (Canadian birth certificate, citizenship card, passport, landed immigrant document, permanent resident card).
- 4. Proof of residency of the parent or guardian and student. This must include TWO items, AT LEAST ONE being from Category A below:
 - i. *Category A*: proof of ownership of dwelling or long-term lease or rental of dwelling; legal documents indicating BC residence; parent or guardian filing income tax returns as a BC resident
 - ii. *Category B*: BC Hydro bill, BC cable bill, Provincial driver's licence, provincial registration of automobile, Canadian bank accounts or credit cards.
- 5. Immunization Records
- 6. Care Card/Personal Health Number
- 7. A completed *Burnaby School District Student Information Form:* (form can be downloaded & completed from the Burnaby School District website www.burnabyschools.ca)
- **8.** A completed *Burnaby School District Medical Information Form:* (form can be downloaded & completed from the Burnaby School District website www.burnabyschools.ca) Note: Severe health concerns require additional forms. These can be obtained from the school that you are applying to attend.
- 9. Copy of the student's most recent school marks (including summer school), such as:
 - i. An official copy of marks from the student's Permanent Record Card; or
 - ii. The student's most recent report card; or
 - iii. A transcript of academic record; or
 - iv. A transfer form with marks
- 10. An emergency telephone contact number of a local person who is available during school hours.
- 11. The name and telephone number of the family doctor or medical clinic.

ARRIVAL & PICK-UP

There is no supervision on the school grounds before or after school.

- We advise parents and students to time their arrival at school to coincide with the 8:55 a.m. bell as much as possible.
- Parents are asked to pick-up their children as soon after 3:00 p.m. as possible.
- If students are coming by car, they MUST be dropped off and picked up on Montecito by the playground and NOT the staff parking lot.



PLEASE REMEMBER to call the school (604) 664-8766 when your child is **ABSENT** due to illness, appointments. etc., or if your child will be **LATE** for any reason. Also, please remember to have <u>your child report to the office for a *LATE SLIP* if they arrive after the bell. We do have a 24 hour Voice-mail system where you can leave a message or you can email the office; rae.shuster@sd41.bc.ca.</u>

Please respect the instruction times of students as much as possible and DELIVER LUNCHES, ETC. TO THE OFFICE.

<u>PLEASE REMEMBER TO SEND CUTLERY</u>
<u>WITH YOUR CHILD'S LUNCHES</u>, we have seen an increase in the number of children asking teachers and staff for spoons & forks!

APPROPRIATE ATTIRE:

- Clothing should be appropriate for an elementary school learning environment.
- Runners which mark the floor are NOT ALLOWED in the gym.
- As we live in a rainforest, students need to wear rain protective outerwear and foot wear. Unless the weather is severe or dangerous, all children will be expected to spend some time outside for fresh air and exercise. We do send children outside on rainy days when it is not a downpour. If students go out and a downpour begins, 2 bells will ring indicating that students should enter the school and go straight to their classroom. Supervisors will monitor students, both in the main building and the portables.
- We encourage students to have a label in their belongings. Our Lost and Found has many unclaimed items.
