From the Superintendent

Strategic Planning

The Minerva Central School Strategic Planning Committee completed their work in late January and presented the proposed Strategic Plan and Advisory Recommendations to the MCS Board of Education during the February 11th regular meeting. The committee, which was assisted by the Capital Area School Development Association (CASDA), included representatives from multiple school and community constituent groups. In all, fourteen (14) school-community representatives worked over several months to develop a three-year strategic plan. The work began last fall and used the results from the CASDA-led focus groups during the 2014-15 school year. The committee identified three (3) goals and associated action steps for recommendation to the School Board. These goals targeted the following main categories: fiscal health, instruction and educational opportunity, and community resources and partnerships. The final report, including the strategic plan, will soon be available on the school's website. I would like to thank the following committee members for their service on this project: Kaleb Davie, Sue Crouse, Joy Healy, Keith Iverson, Jamie Davie, Alice Halloran, Shannon Stone, Hayley Killon, Bone Base, Lisa Fabin, Chris Fink, Candice Husson, and Nancy O'Brien. The school and/or strategic planning committee will be looking for more volunteers to assist with the work that is included in the strategic plan. I anticipate the formation of a separate committee, such as a shared decision making committee, that will be responsible for assisting with the implementation of our strategic plan. If you are interested in representing the community, parent, student, teacher, or non-instructional staff group on such a committee, please contact me.

New Budget Development Newsletter

One of the items identified in the school's strategic plan was to develop two budget newsletters to be distributed to district residents. We have always published one newsletter for distribution in early May, prior to the school budget and board member election. Mrs. O'Brien and I will now also publish a new "Budget Development Newsletter" in late February/early March that will share information on the school budget development process and will provide the budget information that is currently available.

Taylor is one of twenty-one students from the region who were selected based on demonstration of personal growth, leadership, and innovation, along with a commitment to the community. 


