BBCI Report: Trudy Harder

City Council approved the Westgate Health Collaborative to be at the old Westgate Theatre property with the health providers: Providence, Lifeworks and Community Action for one stop shopping, located near MAX so it can quickly open. The Hispanic Center is in the Brick building south of the property. Parking at the Round is very crowded and compressed spaces, concern raised by Bruce Richards in last September's meeting has had any response yet.

Proposed Remodel and wing addition to the Maryville Nursing Home: Jaclyn Benge and Gunnar Lanhus spoke about the proposal to remodel to provide a new skilled nursing wing and expand two existing dining rooms. Washington County will expand Murray Blvd and move the existing bus stop. The plan is to retain the existing mature trees and buffer with some new plantings, keep the turnaround in the parking lot, add 3 new parking spots. The facility is a licensed, skilled nursing which goes thru the state for licensing, staffed 24 hours a day, might add a few more positions. It is being financed thru savings and existing funds. The County road construction timeline is late August. They plan to ensure there is safe lighting, make it safe so there isn't any place to hide out. They are hoping to start construction in the Spring.
