## TYPES OF FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

#### **SCHOLARSHIPS**

There are four basic sources of funds for college:

## PART-TIME JOBS

Possibilities include library or lab assistant, cafeteria worker, clerical worker, custodial worker, and peer adviser. Minimum wage at KU is \$7.50 an hour. Pay varies depending on the job and qualifications.

#### **LOANS**

Many educational loans carry a low interest rate. Loans include the Federal Stafford Loan, Federal Perkins Loan, and the Federal Parent Loan for Undergraduate Students. You must complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid to be eligible.

#### **GRANTS**

Grants are gift aid based on financial need as established by the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). Federal and state grants include the Federal Pell Grant, Federal Supplemental Educational Opportunity Grant, Academic Competitiveness Grant, Science and Mathematics Access to Retain Talent Grant, and Kansas Comprehensive Grant. KU Tuition Grants also are available.
