From Our Pastor

"So when they had come together, they asked him, "Lord, is this the time when you will restore the kingdom to Israel?" He replied, "It is not for you to know the times or periods that the Father has set by his own authority. But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth." When he had said this, as they were watching, he was lifted up, and a cloud took him out of their sight. While he was going and they were gazing up toward heaven, suddenly two men in white robes stood by them. They said, "Men of Galilee, why do you stand looking up toward heaven? This Jesus, who has been taken up from you into heaven, will come in the same way as you saw him go into heaven."
The Acts of the Apostles' 1:6-11

May is a jammed-packed month of celebrations. May is National Physical Fitness and Sports and Lupus Awareness month. The month begins with May Day, Cinco de Mayo, Holocaust Remembrance Day, the Kentucky Derby, Mother's Day, National Brother Day, Armed Forces Day, Memorial Day, World No-tobacco Day, National Burger Day, and mixed in among these are the observance of St. James and St. Philip, Ascension, Pentecost, and Trinity Sunday.

Usually May's article features Pentecost, but this month my thoughts are on the ascension of Jesus. At Shiloh we will sometimes observe his ascension on a Sunday, but usually the day is observed on its proper date—May 5th.

The New Testament calls attention to the fact of Ascension and the fact of the Session at God's right hand. Three words are used in the Greek in connection with the Ascension: "to go up"; "to be taken up"; and "to go."

The Session is connected with Ps 110:1-7, and is frequently referenced or alluded to in all parts of the New Testament. But it is used especially in connection with Christ's priesthood, and with His position of authority and honor at God's right hand. The New Testament emphasizes the fact of Christ's exaltation rather than the mode, the latter being quite secondary.

Yet the acceptance of the fact must be carefully noticed, for it is impossible to question that this is the belief of all the New Testament writers who base their teaching on the fact and do not rest content with the moral or theological aspects of the Ascension apart from the historic reality.

The Ascension is regarded as the point of contact between the Christ of the gospels and of the epistles.

The gift of the Spirit is said to have come from the ascended Christ.

The Ascension is the culminating point of Christ's glorification after His Resurrection, and is regarded as necessary for His heavenly exaltation.

The Ascension was proved and demanded by the Resurrection, though there was no need to preach it as part of the evangelistic message.

It is the culmination of the Incarnation, the reward of Christ's redemptive work, and the entrance upon a wider sphere of work in His glorified condition, as the Lord and Priest of His church.

In summary, for Jesus and the disciples there would be no more breakfasts on the Sea of Galilee, no more showing of wounds, no more breathing peace, no more meeting disciples on the road out of Jerusalem, no more going fishing, no more breaking of bread.

This time, Jesus is leaving this earthly world for good. But just like the first disciples, we are not left alone; no, Jesus sends the Holy Spirit to be with us.

We can't really celebrate Pentecost, the giving of the Holy Spirit, without observing the truth and fact that Jesus was ascended to his heavenly Father, to sit at His right hand, to have the world placed under his authority.

This is the true worth and value of our confession of faith in the Holy Spirit, the Advocate, the one who tells the truth about Jesus, the one who leads, moves, motivates, comforts, and illumines for us our life following the one called Jesus.

The one who we see in flesh and blood in others, in the poor, in the hungry, in the lonely, in the angry, in the hated and the hater, in the Eucharist, our meal of Thanksgiving.

Pentecost is the 50th day of Easter, the day of wind, tongues of fire, appearing drunk with wine, filled with power to share the good news of the gospel that is Jesus Christ, our Lord and Savior, our King, our companion, our friend, our ruler.

Let us not be like the first disciples who look to heaven thinking they will see him come back down right away, but rather look out into the world and see him everywhere.

And then let us in the Spirit, follow where he leads.

Rooney who was on my Candidacy Committee and a mentor to me in seminary as well as a good colleague for my time in Harrisburg; Dr. Carlson who is the supervisor of Field Education at the Lutheran Seminary at Gettysburg and one of the best New Testament teachers and preachers—I am so glad you got to hear him preach; and Pr. McKee who brought greetings from Bishop Dunlop.

And then there are all those, who are still not known to me directly but who worked for some time to organize this honor; thank you for all you accomplished, I am truly humbled and deeply thankful.

Especially, thank you for the stained glass window—it celebrates Eucharist—the vine and the branches. It is glorious.

And then there is Mark, our seminary student that I never sought out, but God brought to us at just the right time. He has been a blessing to us, and we have helped to shape another pastor of God's calling, a servant of Word and Sacrament.

How the Holy Spirit works!

I was thinking about the church day when I got up that morning—Easter 3, it is the same day that I preached my call sermon at Shiloh in 2006; and on Easter 3 in 2013 Cooper was baptized; and he read the gospel so beautifully on Youth Sunday. Additionally, the Letters of Call were signed on April 10, 2006, the same date.

As I was listening to Dr. Carlson's sermon, I was thinking about installation of a pastor where the congregation hands over to the newly called pastor the baptismal font, the altar of our Lord, and the pulpit; the active and alive places and symbols of Word and Sacrament.

This is a pastor's life—births, baptisms, marriages, deaths, feedings, preaching, teaching, walking, comforting, calling, celebrating—and it is a life lived solely by God's grace. I would recommend this life to anyone and everyone, and I hope God allows us to shape more pastors in our congregational life.

Lastly, I hope you know how much I love you as Christ commanded us to love one another as he loves us. Spiritually, hopefully, joyfully, and sacrificially.

Thank you for 10 wonderful years of allowing me to be your pastor, allowing me to feed and tend you as Jesus asked Peter out of love for the Good Shepherd.

In our Synod – 7 counties – approximately 1 in 5 children under age 18, more than 121,000 souls encounter hunger.

Children's Aid Society: of service including home visits. 162 Parent Support Group meetings helped 258 adults through 1,546 hours of group meetings. You can read the entire newsletter on the bulletin board next to the church entrance. Each January, we take out 4% of the Waddell & Reed account that we set aside to honor the wishes of the family of Ellen Hersh. They had requested that we use some of her bequest to help children of divorced parents. We recently received a summary for their fiscal year of 7/1/2014 – 6/30/2015. At the Lehman Center the crisis nursery helped 143 children with 30,700 hours of respite care. Over 2000 hours of art therapy were provided for 204 children. The Family Advocate helped 68 families throughout the year with 1,010 hours

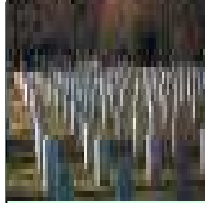

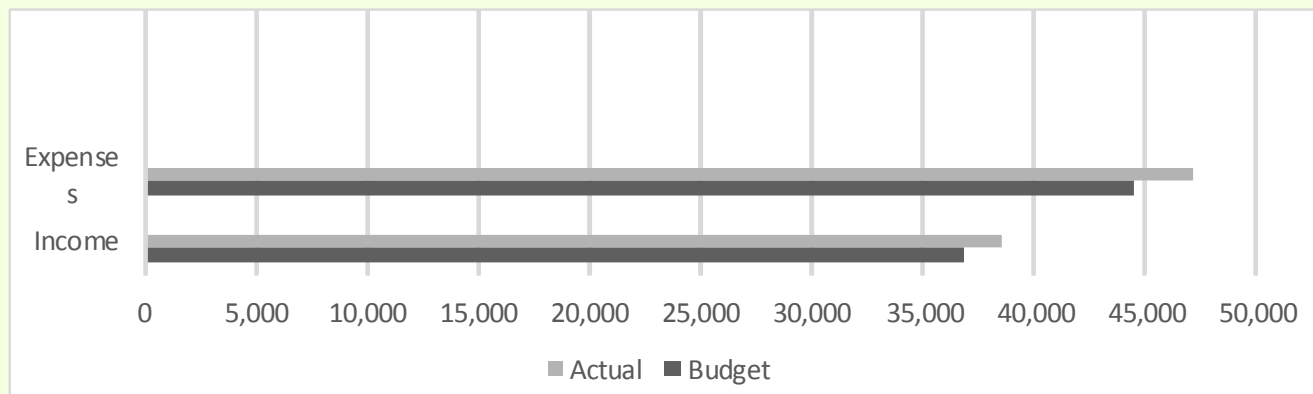

Finance report:

Thank you for your support in March. We continue to meet our budget goal for income. We budgeted for \$36,078.00 and took in \$37,428.00. For the first three months we had budgeted for expenses of \$44,448 and spent \$47,152. We now have a total deficit of \$8,643.00. I recently withdrew \$8,000.00 from our Thrivent Savings account to put in the checking account to cover our expenses. Unless our income increases above the budgeted amount our expense deficit will continue to grow. At the Congregational Meeting last year we stated that if each giving unit increased their offering by \$8.00 per week, we would be able to meet our expenses. Thank you to those who have increased your giving. If you cannot afford \$8.00 per week, even just a few dollars more will help.



During March, the congregation gave \$47.00 to the Nursery School Fund and \$65.00 to New Hope. Thank you to all who contributed to the Pastor's celebration. We were able to cover all our expenses for the window, the Pastors and the reception.

Thank you to all who sponsored me in the **Walk for Hope**. We had beautiful weather this year. With your help, I raised \$270.00.

In May, we are asking the youth of participating churches to conduct a **Toiletry Drive**.

The group that collects the most toiletries, by weight, will win an ice cream party. Our Youth won the party several years ago. New Creation youth won the prize for the last two years. Help us give them a run for their money.

During March, you donated \$60.00, 4 pounds of toiletries and 38 pounds of food to New Hope. Our goal for New Hope is \$100.00 per month to make up for what we used to give from the budget.

Some of the items most needed are peanut butter, tuna, canned meat, canned fruits and vegetables and soup.

We also need toiletries, especially toilet paper, dish soap, bath soap, paper towels, toothpaste and shampoo.

Thank you for your support of New Hope Ministries. Your support helps us feed our clients and provides opportunities for job training, budget classes, cooking classes, and financial aid.

We still have volunteer openings for the office and for the food bank. If you can spare one morning or afternoon a week, we would love to have you join us. See Janet Smith or Beth Slagel for information.
