HOUSING AND FOOD SERVICE CONTRACT/APPLICATION

General Information

While every attempt is made to accommodate student's preferences for assignment, preferences are not guaranteed. The University also reserves the right to assign or change an assignment to a location different from the student's original assignment.

By signing this contract, the student agrees to respect and adhere to all policies, regulations, and procedures pertaining to University standards and any other University publications, which are made a part of this contract by reference. If, as specified in the aforementioned publications, the University reserves the right to change the student's assignment or to consider the contract terminated. When residency is terminated under these conditions, refunds will be made in accordance with the terms of this contract. Applications for University housing are subject to review by the Director of Housing and Residence Life. Pursuant to such review, residency may be denied upon cause and any monies paid, returned prior to occupancy by the student.

All room and board rates are approved by the Marshall University Board of Governor's and are available from the Department of Housing and Residence Life.

ROOM RESERVATION DEPOSIT

All contracts must be accompanied by a \$200.00 Reservation Deposit. This deposit will be deducted from the total amount due for a summer session. Acceptance of a housing reservation does not guarantee admission to the University.

CANCELLATION OF RESIDENCE HALL AND FOOD SERVICE CONTRACT

Cancellation of the Housing Contract must be received in writing by the Housing and Residence Life Office. Cancellations received thirty (30) days before the first official opening day of the residence halls will result in a refund of \$100.00 of the reservation deposit. Cancellations received after that date will result in a forfeiture of the entire \$200.00 reservation deposit.

WITHDRAWAL

After the student has accepted occupancy, voluntary withdrawal from the University and in turn Housing and Food Service will result in the forfeiture of all monies paid for room rent. A prorated refund will be processed for any unused portion of the board plan. Please note that meal assignments are billed for a full week based on the food service vendor's billing cycle. The student remains liable for any unpaid room and board balance due. Students, whose residency is terminated, automatically forfeit all monies paid for that semester. Students who are denied admission; declared academically ineligible to return, or are unable to return for medical reasons will be refunded on a prorated basis.

NON-DISCRIMINATION

No Citizen of the United States or any person within the jurisdiction thereof, shall on the ground of race, color, national origin, religion, sex, age, political affiliation, sexual orientation or handicap, be excluded from participation in, be denied the benefits of, or be subjected to discrimination University housing or food service. In accordance with this, no individual will be excluded from housing on the basis of such factors, nor will such factors, other than sex, be considered in making initial room assignments nor in approving requests for room changes, with the exception that the needs of physically challenged students and no tobacco preference will be evaluated in room assignment decisions.
