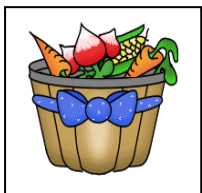

School happenings:

- This week, students in grades 2-6 will participate in a **prayer attitude survey**. They will do it again in the spring. We will look for increased religious knowledge and prayer practices. This is part of our Catholic Identity Accreditation goal.
- Our first quarter honors will be announced after the Children's Liturgy this Wednesday. **First Honors** is earned for all As, **Second Honors** is earned for a B average, and **Progress Award** is earned by students who have not gone down in any letter grades since last grading period (midterms). Did you know?

- The Pint Size Hero blood drive will take place Monday, November 23 from 9 a.m.- 2 p.m. in the school gym (students are not in school that day). Please consider being a donor.
- The average adult has 10 pints of blood inside them.
- One pint of blood saves 3 lives.
- It takes 56 days to regenerate one pint of blood.
- Although 60% of the U.S. population is eligible to donate blood, only about 5% do.
