Intermediate Motorcycle Class (IC)

This class is for riders with some experience but no previous training, those wanting to improve their skills, or those seeking a license waiver. Students who enroll in the IC must have held a current motorcycle learner's permit for at least 60 days. The IC course consists of 5 hours of classroom theory and 7 hours of practical application (riding). Students must provide a street legal, insured, and fully registered motorcycle to ride during the class. Fully licensed and insured scooters are permitted, however, mopeds are prohibited. To successfully complete the IC the student must pass both a written and riding assessment. Successful completion of the course makes the student eligible for an insurance discount. Upon successful completion of this course, students will be provided with an opportunity to take the state's Motorcycle Driver's License Road Test. If the student achieves a passing score the DMV may accept this test in lieu of SCDMV's motorcycle driver's license road test.

Prerequisite:

- Good clutch/throttle control is a must. Students should feel comfortable with the motorcycle's weight and size
- Must have held a motorcycle learner's permit for a minimum of 60 days
- All students must provide a street legal, insured, fully registered motorcycle
- Fully licensed and insured scooters are permitted, however, mopeds are prohibited

Benefits:

- DMV may waive the driver's motorcycle license test
- Insurance companies may provide a premium discount

GROUND RULES ACKNOWLEDGEMENT

- It's a prerequisite for this course that you currently operate a motorcycle with good CLUTCH/THROTTLE CONTROL and without being intimidated by its weight and size.
- The class will start on time and will stay on schedule. If you miss a classroom session or range exercise, you will be dropped from the course. A tuition refund will not be issued.
- > You are required to wear the following protective clothing during EVERY range session:
 - □ A DOT approved helmet (some are available for your use). *Half coverage helmets are prohibited*!
 - ☐ Eye protection, i.e., faceshield, sunglasses, goggles, glasses
 - □ Long sleeve shirt or jacket
 - □ Long pants, preferably jeans or leather
 - Over the ankle boots or shoes with low heels (heels over one inch are not suitable.)
 - □ Full finger gloves

You will not be permitted to participate in any range session without proper protective gear.

- Coaches will strive to provide a safe and orderly environment. Students behaving in a reckless, disrespectful, or unruly manner will be dropped from the class at the Coach's discretion. Impairment is strictly prohibited. A tuition refund will not be issued.
- You will be learning to ride in a group environment. Coaches will do their best to provide individual coaching and instruction to each student. However, time is limited and the Coaches must keep the class on schedule.
- > South Carolina's Technical College Intermediate Rider Course takes a building block approach to improving your skills of riding a motorcycle. Each exercise builds on the skills, knowledge, and confidence acquired in the previous exercises. If you are unable to consistently achieve exercise objectives, the Coach will counsel you out of the course. A tuition refund will not be issued.
- It's natural to be nervous about learning new skills on your motorcycle. While some fear is to be expected, excessive fear can lead to tenseness and ultimately to mistakes on the riding range. If the Coach perceives that you have an excessive amount of fear and are a danger to yourself or other students, the Coach will counsel you out of the course. A tuition refund will not be issued.
- You are expected to follow directions provided by the Coaches. Failing to following instructions repeatedly may be grounds for dismissal by the Coach. A tuition refund will not be issued.

To obtain your Motorcycle Safety Foundation completion card, you will be required to pass both a written and riding test. The Coach's decision is final with respect to whether you have passed or failed a test. *Retests are not authorized.* A DMV license waiver may be authorized. A tuition refund will not be issued.
