Assignment 3: Final Essay Outline

Instructor: Jennifer Lundin Ritchie

In this assignment, you will use a similar *format* to Assignment 2: The Five Paragraph Essay, to create a **point-form version** of your Final Essay Assignment: The Five Page Essay.

- A) You can choose to continue writing about the same topic, OR you can select a new topic.
- 1. The Qin Emperor: about his harsh laws and punishments, search for immortality elixirs, public works
- 2. Li Si: about the Emperor's harsh laws and punishments, search for immortality elixirs, public works
- 3. Liu Bang (Gaozu): about his military strategy toward the Xiongnu
- 4. Emperor Wu: about his military strategy toward the Xiongnu
- 5. **Ruler of the Xiongnu:** about his military strategy towards the Han and his opinions on Liu Bang and Emperor Wu's approaches
- 6. **Wang Mang:** about his economic strategies of taking land/wealth from the wealthy elites and giving it to the poor commoners
- 7. **Prince Gautama Siddhartha (The Buddha):** about his choice of pursuing a spiritual life instead of becoming a great ruler of an empire
- 8. Yang Jian: about his policy of mixing cultures to create the Sui dynasty
- 9. **Taizong:** about how he administrated the Tang Philosophical/Religious Debates
- 10. **Wuzong:** about his decision to try to crush Buddhism in the Tang
- 11. **The Shatuo Turks:** about their decision to keep supporting the Tang dynasty
- 12. **Zhenzong:** about his decision to make a treaty with the Liao (Khitan people)
- 13. **Renzong:** about his decision to make a treaty with the Xi Xia (Tangut people)
- 14. Huizong and Qinzong: bout their decision to welcome the Jin (Jurchen people) as allies
- 15. Wang Anshi: about his policies for economic reform.
- 16. **Ghengis Khan:** your choice (1) Was he a cruel, brutal psychopath? (2) Was he just an average Mongol?
- (3) Was he not an average Mongol? or (4) Was he a brilliant leader?
- 17. **Kubilai Khan:** about his decision to make a "Chinese" dynasty
- 18. **Zhu Yuanzhang:** about his rule by force, his treatment of elites and the poor, or his decision to encourage agriculture
- 19. **Zhu Di**: about his rule by force, his decision to encourage maritime trade
- 20. **Xuanzong:** about his decision to focus on food and art instead of government
- 21. Jesuits: about their attempts to convert China to Christianity, integrate Christianity and Confucianism.
- 22. Nergaci: about his method of mixing force and virtue to gain control/support from other groups
- 23. Qianlong: (1) about his rule by virtue, multiculturalism, morality, or (2) the Canton system
- 24. The Examination System: about the decision to make them increasingly difficult to pass in the Qing
- B) Turning a Five Paragraph Essay into a Five Page Essay is not difficult. You still need an Introduction section and a Conclusion section. The main change is that your Points 1, 2, and 3 will *each* be like a mini-essay inside your big essay. So each Point will become its own mini-Thesis Statement, and you will need additional evidence to support each one.

This outline is meant to be a <u>point-form list</u> of elements you will include in your final essay. It needs to include *all* of the following elements *in this order:*

- 1. Conclusion: "Based on these 2 evidences, and , it is clear that [Point 1] is true."
- 2. Impact/Importance: Why should anyone care that Point 1 is true?
- 3. make a connection to Point 2
