The WSPE leadership and members are very proud of their involvement with MathCounts. They produced the national champion last year. While their student membership numbers are declining, they intend to enhance those programs and gain additional members. WSPE is heavily involved with a WA coalition called the Association of Engineering Leadership Council (AELC, may not be the proper termination) whereby they are engaged with other engineering societies and others in legislative activities.

I was very impressed by a number of younger members who each are heavily involved in the leadership tasks of WSPE. I was also impressed by the return of many senior leaders who continue their involvement in both WSPE and NSPE activities. I have notes in my travel file with respect to the identity of key leaders.

Did you hear of any major issues related to the governance and operations of the state that NSPE should be aware of? If so, please describe.

I noted that the Western & Pacific Region has posed position statements for review of the NSPE HoD, which was surprising, but which the WSPE ultimately approved without debate or discussion. I fear that some of these resolutions may not be consistent with the attitudes and beliefs of WSPE membership. It was noted that the W&P Region had elected to NOT charge their traditional \$5/member dues this year, but the WSPE budgeted for that fee next year.

Please indicate any newsworthy or image-enhancing events, programs, projects, or personalities that should be forwarded to the NSPE Publications Department for consideration as a news or feature story.

There was a lot of attention to a new organization, "Engineers without Borders", with whom many WSPE members seemed to identify. There was associated discussion of some mechanism for commodity for licensees of, for example, certain provinces of Canada with either Washington, or Oregon (it was noted that Oregon apparently has some arrangement with the Japanese Society of Professional Engineers, whereby the latter can become licensed, perhaps temporarily, by Oregon in order to practice in this country, albeit on a very brief and abbreviated basis.

Other comments on your visit For those who have failed to visit the State of Washington in May, you have missed a legitimate "piece of Paradise" in this US of A. The traditional decision by the leadership of the WSPE to meet in a resort, is marvelous, especially for visitors and guests. During our 4-day visit, we saw 3 days of beautiful sunshine and no wind, which was idyllic. On the 4th day, however, we saw the traditional Washington rain and wind, and were actually snowed upon when crossing the pass back to Seattle.

We were honored and pleased to have been accepted and included in all of the WSPE events, and had the privilege of personally visiting with a large segment of the WSPE leadership.
