- Re-publication of critical texts in our history: Walking Together: Polity and Participation in Unitarian Universalism, by Conrad Wright; Freedom Moves West, by Charles Lyttle; Hunted Heretic, by Roland Bainton.
- Support of important projects, such as Long Strange Trip, a DVD film series by Ron Cordes; and Unitarian and Universalist Women: Liberating History, from ten yearly calendars by UUWHS.
