2006 Sight and Hearing Report:

2006 was another busy year with screenings, eyeglass collection, and eye exam and glasses referrals.

Vision Screenings 2006:

Eight screenings were held in Day Care centers. 182 three to five year olds were screened. Six were referred for professional exams. Since starting in August of 2004 we have screened 530 children and referred 27 for re-screening or exams. Thanks to all the screeners and helpers, you have positively helped save and improve children's eyesight in Rochester.

Hearing 2006:

Seven hearing aids were collected and sent to the Hearing Foundation in Minneapolis. The club helped fund (\$200.00) for an individual to get a hearing test. This person had funding for hearing aids but no resources to get the test.

Eyeglass collection 2006:

We continue with our "Recycle for Sight" program. We had our lowest count this year since we started with 4700 pairs collected. This was due in part to losing our collection box at the Main Post Office. However, people are now bringing the glasses directly to the clerks at the counter and they are saving them for me. We started this program in 1999 and this year's count puts us just over 50,000. We also have about 10 boxes out in the community.

Eye Exam and Glasses referrals 2006:

The club funded and/or facilitated 54 exams and glasses this year. This is way up from last year. Over 90% of these are children referred by School Nurses or Social Workers. Again, these are kids helped right here in Rochester. This is why we work so hard at fundraising. Everyone should be very proud of this program.
