## News from Greater Bassett (John Smokey Pegram and Ruby Davis)

The Stanleytown Ruritan Club is excited to assist in erecting a Historical Marker near the intersection of U.S. Rt. 57 and state route \#903(Governor Stanley Highway) in Stanleytown. The marker will tell about the first courthouse in Henry County, near Edgewood, [Edgewood will be the title of the marker], the Great Road nearby, and Governor Thomas B. Stanley. Dr. John Bing, a local historian and retired doctor whose practice was located in Bassett, is asking for assistance in having this marker erected. The cost of the Marker through the Virginia Department of Historic Resources is approximately $\$ 1,500.00$. Once the Marker is purchased the Virginia Department of Transportation will erect and take ownership of the Marker. The placement of this marker is another way to profile our history.
