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QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS

- Q: Where are we going?
- A: Forest Lawn Scout Reservation (FLSR) Camp Pollock. Please print out the driving directions included in this package. Camp is situated at an elevation of 5,500 ft. FLSR property covers 2,200 acres.
- Q: If we are going to be at an elevation of 5,500 ft, what will the temperature be like?
- A: We will likely experience a broad range of temperatures. Daytime temperatures may hit the 90's, while nighttime temperatures may drop as low as 50 degrees! It is important to note that the higher elevation places us closer to the damaging effects of the sun during the day, so it is critical that we use sun protection. The higher elevation also means that the air is drier, which means we need to drink plenty of water to keep hydrated! Since the temperatures drop at night, you may want an extra layer of clothing to keep comfortable.
- Q: How long does it take to get there?
- A: It is approximately 90 minutes from Brea to FLSR, unless you encounter traffic, which is very likely on a Friday afternoon. Please keep this in mind when you are scheduling your departure time. You will want to make sure that you have sufficient time to arrive, settle into camp, and be ready for our first activity on Friday evening!
- Q: What if an emergency occurs while we are at camp?
- A: As part of our Camp Orientation on Friday Night, we will be advised of emergency procedures within camp. In the event of an injury or illness, the camp is staffed with 3 Registered Nurses and 2 Emergency Medical Technicians.
- Q: What are we going to be doing at Family Camp?
- A: We are going to enjoy several different outdoor activities, including horses, canoeing, fishing, swimming, hiking, tenting, and generally enjoying our beautiful local mountains in a very low-stress environment. A schedule of events for the weekend is included, and will be provided to each family after checking in at the Administration building upon arrival



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It is important to note that while all of our activities will take place on the FLSR property, the grounds are vast, hilly, and generally involve a 10-15 minute walk between events. Therefore, it is highly recommended that everyone dress comfortably, wear sturdy close-toed shoes, carry a tote or backpack with you with extra clothing, sunscreen, towel, items for the day, etc. This will enable you to proceed from one activity to the next without requiring extra time to head back to your tent or car.

- Q: Will we be able to have S'mores around the campfire?
- A: Yes! On Saturday night we will enjoy a Pack Family Campfire, Songs, Skits, and S'mores!
- Q: Songs and Skits? Will we be watching performers?
- A: Yes! Each pack family is asked to come to Family Camp prepared with a short song or skit (2-3 minutes) to perform during our Pack Family Campfire. If you wish, you may bring simple props and/or costumes. This wildly popular, side-splitting, unforgettable event will take place on Saturday evening with Cub Master Koos serving as our emcee. If you are timid or short on ideas, feel free to ask any other experienced family camp pack families for ideas. There are skits appropriate for all personalities!
- Q: What will the camp staff be serving us during mealtimes?
- A: The menus for each meal are pre-planned by the camp staff and will be revealed at each mealtime in the dining hall. They use absolutely no nut products or nut oils in any of their dishes.
- Q: Can I bring snacks?
- A: The camp will feed us well, but you are welcome to bring along snacks if you would like. However, it is recommended that you keep food items securely stored at all times.

Now let's go have some fun! And don't forget to print and complete these docs and bring with you!




2014 Family Camp Directions

Forest Lawn Scout Reservation - Camp Pollock 29485 Hook Creek Road Cedar Glen, Ca 92321

Driving Time from Brea to Camp Pollock: approximately 90 minutes WITHOUT TRAFFIC.

- 57 North to 210 East
- Exit 76: Waterman Avenue/Highway 18
- Left on Waterman Avenue
- Continue heading North on Waterman, which becomes Highway 18
- Follow all signs for Lake Arrowhead
- Turn RIGHT onto Highway 173
- As you approach the gateway sign for Lake Arrowhead Village, turn RIGHT on Hook Creek Road (Mountain Country Realty is on the corner):
- After turning onto Hook Creek Road, you will see Jensen's Market & Deli on your left. Please note this is probably the last opportunity to pick up Friday Night dinner, if





Turn RIGHT onto Deep Creek Camp Road. You will see the sign for Forest Lawn Scout Reservation on the corner. (see photo on the right):







2014 Family Camp Directions

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- Drive <u>SLOWLY</u> along the narrow winding road through the reservation.
- Continue past the "Welcome to Forest Lawn Scout Reservation -Camp Pollock" sign and totem pole:



Veer to the left and <u>park your</u> <u>vehicle in the parking lot</u> where you see the following sign for the Administration Building:

2014 Family Camp – What to Bring

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Food & Drink

- Bring your own meal for Friday evening, or eat on the way to camp. You may bring your favorite snacks and beverages for between meals if desired.
- All meals on Saturday & Sunday morning are provided by the camp.
- If you bring food, please keep it safely stored in animal-proof containers.

Shelter

- o Tent
- Ground cover/tarp (moisture barrier under tent)
- Air mattress or camp mat (optional)
- Sleeping bags
- o Pillows
- Blankets (optional)

Clothing

- Class A scout uniform shirt for Saturday evening campfire activities (remove ribbons, beads, and other "hanging awards, belt loops and neckerchiefs – we don't want you to lose them!)
- Class B scout uniform (pack T-shirt and den hat)
- Comfortable clothes (jeans, sweats, shorts, etc.)
- Light and heavy jacket/hooded sweatshirt
- Gloves/beanies for extra warmth at night
- Flip flops or Water sandals for showers and pool
- o Comfortable, durable shoes
- Extra socks
- o Pajamas
- o Swim suits/rash guards
- o Towels
- Tote bag or backpack (for carrying necessary items from one activity to the next)
- o Costumes/Props for the Campfire
