Gary Henderson - Associate Head Coach



Gary Henderson, former National Assistant Coach of the Year, returns for his fifth season as a coach for the Wildcats. Before joining Coach Cohen at UK, Coach Henderson spent five seasons as pitching coach and recruiting coordinator at Oregon State University. Henderson served in the same capacity at the University of Florida from 1995-1998, during which time the Gators had two appearances at the College World Series. *Collegiate Baseball* newspaper named Henderson it's National Assistant Coach of the Year in 1996 when the Gators were crowned Southeastern Conference Champions. A native of Eugene, Oregon, Henderson has a Bachelor's degree in English and a Master's degree in Sport Psychology from San Diego State University.

Brad Bohannon - Assistant Coach



Brad Bohannon, a former standout baseball player at Berry College, begins his third season as a full-time assistant coach at Kentucky after spending two seasons as the Wildcats' volunteer assistant coach. Bohannon played two years of professional baseball for the Dubois County Dragons (Huntington, Indiana) and was named to the 1997 Heartland League All-Star team. He earned a Bachelor's degree in finance from Berry College (1998) and holds a Master's Degree in business administration from Wake Forest (2000).

Keith Vorhoff - Volunteer Assistant Coach



Keith Vorhoff is in his first season as a volunteer assistant coach with Kentucky. He spent the 2006 season working as a volunteer assistant with the Southeastern Louisiana University baseball program, working mainly with the pitching staff. Vorhoff helped improve the staff ERA from 5.34 in 2006 to 4.07 in 2007. Vorhoff has served as a summer league coach for two excellent clubs, including a current head coach position for the Chillicothe Mudcats. He also served as the assistant coach for the Anchorage Bucs in the Alaska Summer Collegiate Baseball League, coaching 19 players selected

in the MLB Draft.

Athletic Trainer

A certified Athletic Trainer will be a permanent member of our camp staff. Training facilities are located adjacent to Cliff Hagan Baseball stadium in the Shively Sports Center.

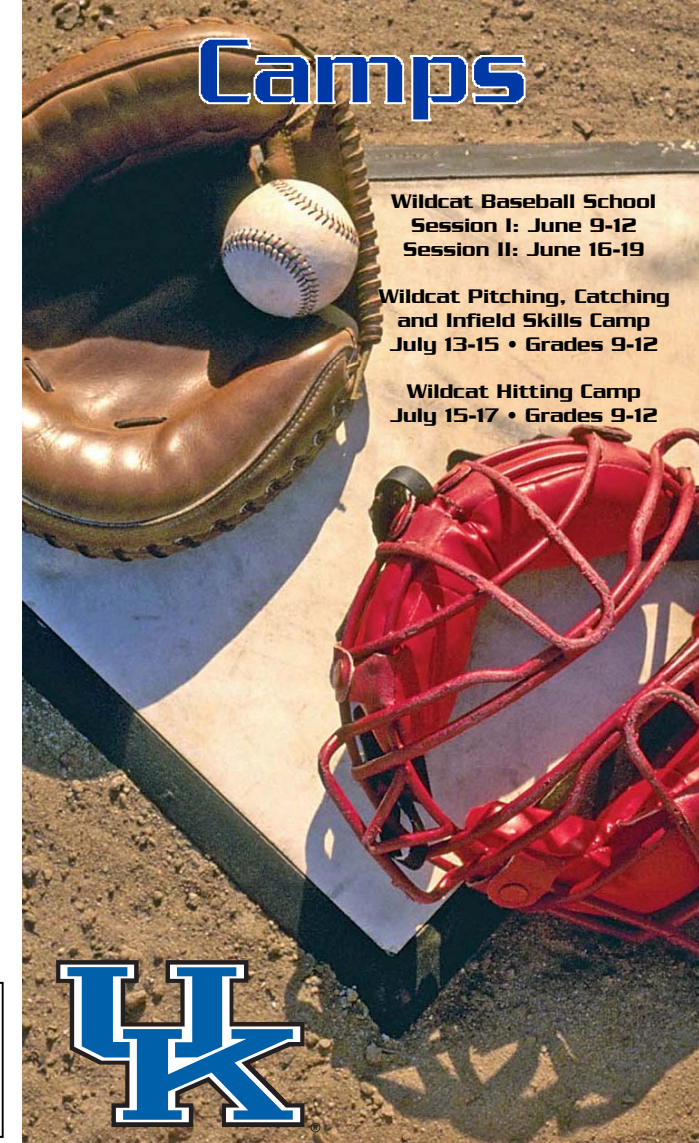
Additional Camp Staff

John Cohen - Head Coach



Kentucky baseball head coach John Cohen, in his fifth season at the helm of the Wildcat baseball program, has directed the most remarkable turnaround in the history of Southeastern Conference baseball. Under Cohen's guidance, Kentucky rewrote the record books during a historic 2006 campaign, going from a last place finish in 2005 to a school record 44 wins in 2006, notching the first SEC Championship in the 103-year history of the program. Following the unprecedented success of the 2006 season, Cohen was recognized as the SEC Coach of

the Year and the National Coach of the Year by collegebaseballinsider.com and by the College Baseball Foundation. In 2007, Cohen's club continued to dismantle the UK baseball history books, as the Wildcats opened the season 19-0, good for the longest winning streak and the best start to a season in school history. The 2007 Wildcats ended the season with 34 wins, the fifth most victories in UK history. UK has a combined 78 wins during 2006-07, marking Kentucky's most wins in a two-year period. Well known as one of the top offensive minds in college baseball, Cohen has directed the best hitting club in the SEC over the last two years. In 2006, Cohen's team piled up a school-record 500 runs, 337 walks, 80 hit-by-pitches and 67 sacrifice bunts. Cohen's exciting brand of baseball drew in national attention in 2006, ranking third in the nation in home runs, third in slugging percentage, seventh in doubles, and 13th in scoring, while leading the SEC in eight offensive categories. In 2007, Cohen's club led the nation in on-base percentage, set the school record for triples, hit by pitches, and sacrifice flies, as well as posting a .320 team batting average, one point shy of the school record. Cohen spent the summer of 2005 touring the United States, Japan and Taiwan with Team USA, serving as the assistant coach and hitting instructor. Before leading the Wildcats to national prominence, Cohen distinguished himself at the University of Florida as an assistant coach and hitting instructor, tearing up the Gator offensive record books during his tenure. Cohen also served as an assistant coach at the University of Missouri and as the head coach at Northwestern State University for four seasons. While at NSU, Cohen was twice named Southland Conference Coach of the Year. Cohen, a Tuscaloosa, Ala. native, is a 1990 graduate of Mississippi State where he was an All-SEC outfielder and a Minnesota Twins draft pick.

How to Register

Our camps fill up quickly and are available on a first-come, first-served basis. **Registration may be completed by mail or online.**

Mail: Complete the attached registration form, include check or money order for full amount or non-refundable deposit (\$50) and **mail no later than two weeks from the first day of camp** to:

Online: Register online at www.ukathletics.com (**follow camp links**). Full payments or \$50 deposit, by credit card and electronic checks, are accepted for online registration. Online registration will be open through noon on the Friday before camp begins.

In person: In the event that space is available, walk-up registrations will be accepted. A \$10 late fee will apply for walk-up registration. Cash or personal or cashier/certified checks only. Please call 859.533.3684 for information on walk-up registration.

A \$50 non-refundable deposit must accompany each application. Balance may be paid at camp check-in in the form of cash, personal checks, or cashier/certified check.

Camp fee includes camp t-shirt, frame-by-frame hitting and/or throwing video analysis (where applicable) and lunch. Note: campers attending more than one session will receive one t-shirt.

Medical Information and Requirements

The University of Kentucky requires:

1. a signed Parental Consent Statement (see reverse side),
2. proof of a physical, dated within one year of camp. (The physical may be mailed separately from the application or presented to the camp trainer at check-in) Physician's Statement is acceptable in lieu of a physical, and
3. a copy of the front and back of camper's health insurance card.

Confirmation

Campers will receive a confirmation letter upon receipt of application and deposit. Please allow two weeks for confirmation via regular mail.

Checklist of Things to Bring

Baseball items: one cap, one pair of tennis-type shoes (no spikes), baseball glove, bat, practice shorts, baseball pants or sweat pants, athletic socks, supporter, practice shirts. **Overnight campers** should also bring bedding (pillow, sheets, blanket for twin bed), towel, toiletries, and a **personal check for \$30 for key deposit**. All campers may wish to bring spending money for souvenirs and concessions. *All personal items should be labeled. We ask that you please do not bring valuables.*

Roommates

If you have a definite roommate preference, please register as early as possible. **Both campers** must request each other on their application. If you do not request a roommate, you will be assigned one of a similar age.

NCAA rules prohibit payment of camp expenses (camp tuition, transportation, spending money, etc.) for prospects (9th grade and above) by University of Kentucky boosters. NCAA rules also prohibit free or reduced camp admissions for prospects. If you have any questions, notify camp officials prior to attending camp.
