THE CHURCH WILL DIE IF...

- 1. False Teaching goes unchecked. Tolerate error in the name of "fairness" or "broad-mindedness." Let doctrinal problems fester until they defy solution.
- 2. We do nothing to stop gossip and back-biting. Let rumors circulate without restraint about members of the congregation, especially its leaders and their families. Believe everything you hear-that way, no one will want to lead for fear of being picked to pieces.
- 3. We place a low estimate on the need for congregational unity. Allow the contentious to divide the church into camps that do not have anything to do with each other. Drive a wedge between members, fragmenting the strength and influence of the body. A good fuss will set the congregation back at least an entire generation.
- 4. We de-emphasize mission work. Reason that there is no cause to be alarmed with somebody halfway across the world when there are so many good works at home that way, the church is isolated and loses sight of its higher purpose.
- 5. We tolerate sin in the church. Do nothing about worthless members whose lives bring shame to the church and indignity to the name of Christ. Foster a cold, spiritless, uncaring atmosphere in the Worship Services. Make no effort to make visitors feel welcome.
- 6. We soft-peddle the subject of giving. Offer no bold challenges requiring sacrifice for fear of offending the stingy.
- 7. We offer young people recreation and entertainment but no help with their spiritual lives. Offer them no opportunities to serve others to flex their spiritual muscles. Tacitly suggest that the sacrificial, cross-bearing life that makes Christianity come alive is for grown-ups; let them be content with an endless succession of wiener roasts.
- 8. We complain! If we... Complain about the singing. Complain about the preaching. Complaining about Gospel Meetings. Complain about fellowship meals. Complain about any activities with our spiritual family.

Did you read the above thoughtfully and carefully? We must work diligently if the church is to grow and thrive!

GETTING TO KNOW YOUR BIBLE!

Five Wavs the Lord's Will Is Communicated in the Bible

How is this rule of exclusion to be applied today? In Matthew 26:17, 26-29, for example, the elements to be used in the Lord's Supper are specified, namely "unleavened bread" and "fruit of the vine" (i.e. grape juice, cf. Lev. 25:5; Rev. 14:18). Would it be according to God's will to substitute or add other things (e.g. potatoes, peanut butter, cake, lemonade, coffee) to this memorial? The Bible never say, "Do not add..." followed by a long list of prohibited ingredients, because the rule of exclusion makes this unnecessary. (See last week's segment on the Rule of Exclusion). Another example is musical praise in Christian worship. Every passage in the New Testament that addresses music in Christian worship always specifies vocal praise or heartbased singing (Eph. 5:19; Col. 3:16, etc.). Would the addition of other kinds of music be according to the revealed will of God? If so, why? If not, why not?
