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What is the Project You Would Like to Work On

Our project is to create a process that engages faculty in Student Learning Outcomes Assessment (SLOA) for our Ohlone College General Education Plan A Pattern. We would like a process that helps to inform and improve our General Education courses and program, which also exhibits the characteristics of the Proficiency/Sustainable Implementation Levels as defined by the ACCJC/WASC Rubric for Institutional Effectiveness for SLOA. We want our process for General Education SLOA to be faculty-driven and to promote ongoing professional critical thinking about teaching and learning practice for the purpose of continuous improvement in General Education. We want to meet accreditation standards in a pragmatic way building as much as possible from assessment work faculty are already doing. We want our process of General Education Assessment to encourage creativity and robust dialogue amongst faculty regarding assessment results leading to active improvement plans.

How do we promote grassroots faculty-driven efforts in General Education assessment, with ongoing and dynamic dialogue, within the structure of the accreditation standards and the ACCJC/WASC Rubric for Institutional Effectiveness for SLOA?

How do we create a culture of non-judgmental assessment, focusing more on critical thinking about data and implications, rather than an overemphasis on the process of data gathering?
