| Step 6: Safety and alcohol or other drug use. Most people use alcohol. Many use drugs. Much of this use is legal and some is not. The legal outcomes of illegal drugs battered woman, may hurt her relationship with her children, and put her at a disadvan actions with her battering partner.
