## From Phone Bills to Hope and "Love"

I am often asked how we handle people calling for financial assistance. We have a written policy for emergency and non-emergency financial assistance, but what I "love" about Love INC is we take each person and situation individually and determine how best we can assist. Sometimes that might be referring to one of our pantries to free up income so they can apply their money to the financial need; sometimes it is simply a referral to an agency that gets federal or state funds to help. Other times we might collaborate with one or more churches and agencies to fulfill the need, if it is one that falls through the cracks. Having said that, it's important to know that when people call with eviction notices or utility shut-offs, the cost can be several hundred or even into the thousands. There are times when the best referral can be to a shelter where they have no expenses for awhile and have some time to get back on their feet. No two situations are the same. What I always say to our staff and volunteers is that we can always offer *hope* because we know that there is nothing that our God cannot do, and in the meantime we can walk hand in hand with people through their circumstances.

Recently a single woman came for assistance with her phone bill. Normally we would think of a phone as a luxury, but because we asked about their situation, we discovered that she *really needed* her phone to contact doctors, the Social Security Administration, (SSA) and to give her contact with others since she suffers from anxiety and depression. She was divorced 5 years ago from an abusive spouse and bought a small home in Muskegon. She was working but became debilitated from a congenital neck disease and fibromyalgia that caused constant pain. Because she was in the process of applying for disability through her employer and SSA and had medical issues and appointments, she absolutely needed a phone. We contacted her phone carrier to have all the unneeded extras removed that would reduce her future bills and then proceeded to find the money to keep her phone service active. Helping her with this gave her a reason to smile and she left Love INC with the feeling that someone really does care. She had gone to other agencies in town and no one else would assist with this bill. This is why I "love" Love INC. We have the opportunity each and every day to be the hands and feet of Jesus, whether that is providing food and clothing and other basic needs or assisting someone in a financial crisis through budgeting or helping them find a church or praying for them or even offering a smile or a hug. And we do that frequently!

We couldn't do this ministry without you, our volunteers and supporters. Summertime is typically hard on our finances. If you can give extra this summer so that we can continue meeting the many legitimate needs in our community like the one above, please do so. Mostly, keep us in your prayers, that we would all be encouragers and that we would have strength to do this important ministry each day. God bless you.

#### Grants Provide Love INC Clients with Necessities

Love INC applies for and is often blessed with grants from different organizations. This year we received \$8,000 from the **Julia Hackley Fund** of the Community Foundation of Muskegon. So far in the months of May and June, this donation has helped 14 clients with rent, water, gas, and electric bills. Without these funds, these people could have lost their home, power, water or heat (See article to the right for a Love Story).

The <u>City of Muskegon</u> has been a faithful giver through their Community Development Block Grant funds (CDBG) to provide handicap ramps for residents in the city of Muskegon. "Project Ramp" has received applications from five (5) city residents. The first of these ramps was built in June. Without these funds, these residents might not have a ramp. Additional funds for ramps come from individuals, (some through United Way designated donations), agencies, churches and health care providers.

<u>Mercy Health Partners</u> Sister Simone fund provided a \$4,500 grant to also provide handicap ramps in Muskegon County. There are a total of 22 applications received thus far, of which 5 ramps were built in May and June. This same fund also provided a \$9,000 grant that will provide stoves and refrigerators to over 40 clients this year. Love INC is partnering with MSU Extension in this grant to provide nutritional information and services to appliance recipients.

The above organizations are a huge compliment to the services we provide through our partner churches. Without these various funds and grants, Love INC could not fill some of the above requests. To

## Project Ramp Update

As of 6-21-10, Project Ramp has received 33 requests for applications for handicap ramps. Of the ones sent, 16 were returned, 5 built, and 7 waiting to be built. We thank employees of Kaydon and Alcoa Howmet as well as the Northside Lions for donating their time to build these ramps. Additional interest has come from Care Givers and Wheel Chair/Scooter vendors because they see the need for ramps from their clients.

☆ This story is about a couple who came to Love INC for help. They needed rent money to prevent ☆ them from being evicted and becoming homeless. ☆ "Charles" lost his job in October. Because he was ☆ part time, he was not aware that he could draw un-÷ employment until their money ran out and they ☆ went to DHS for help. He applied, but hadn't yet ★ received any money. "Mary" has narcolepsy and ☆ cannot work. She was working full time until her  $\star$  illness got worse and she received a diagnosis. She  $\star$  was denied disability, which is normal the first  $\star$  time, and has reapplied. She is waiting long term ☆ disability from her employer, which will last up to ★ 18 months or until she is approved for SSDI (Social ☆ Security Disability).

The couple have 2 children and at the time of the ☆ request, had no income. Help was pending through DHS and Charles was attending Work First to help  $\frac{1}{2}$ find employment. These clients had never asked for assistance in the past. Love INC provided them ☆ with rent money through The Julia Hackley Fund and provided them with pajamas for their kids and a gift card to Plumbs for food. Love INC is also helping to connect them to a local church per their re-☆ quest. This is Love INC in action! ☆

My First Year as A Love INC Mentor

During my first year as a volunteer Mentor at LoveINC I have had the pleasure of working with both individuals and families from situational poverty (lost job or hours at work, divorce, out of control credit card debt, etc.) and generational poverty (two generations on government assistance). I have found that situational poverty cases mostly involve assisting with client motivation, discipline, accountability and monitoring of spending habits. While generational poverty involves much, much more. I realized that dealing with clients from generational poverty requires a deeper level of involvement with personal trust, planning, goal setting, emotional support, coping strategies and prayer. I find it difficult to merely discuss financial/ budgeting issues with generational clients. Rising out of poverty takes a greater and deeper commitment on the part of the mentor.

Sounds like a lot of work...? Not true, the rewards and satisfaction to the mentor are enormous. I have learned that by giving a few hours of my time each week I could *transform a life*, and assist in the process of moving a family out of poverty.

Unemployment continues to be unacceptably high ( around 15%) in Muskegon County. There is no apparent relief in sight. More of our families, friends, and neighbors will face financial challenges in the months and years to come.

LoveINC provides a necessary and valuable service in aiding our brothers and sisters in need. They are efficient and effective in providing such services, but need help. Please consider "Helping Neighbors In Need" by sharing your time, talent and treasure with LoveINC. It will be one of the most rewarding experiences of your life. Remember:
