

What is the members-suppliers Accreditation program?

This Programs emerges from our members need to obtain products or services from reliable suppliers. Also, the suppliers must be able to insure excellence and quality of service to their clients. The most needed areas of services identified by our members were: accounting services and systems, human resources and payroll processing.

Human Resources Administration

It includes: Development and administration of an employees manual. This manual must include policies and procedures of disciplinary handling. It must establish and also maintain an absenteeism registry, a system to administer employees benefits including vacations, sick days, workman's compensation and training. It should also include a section on performance evaluation. It is required that the supplier offer consultation services on labor subjects, with limitless access of personnel to verify the fulfillment of federal and local laws.

Accounting

It includes: Establishment and revision of transactions registry, maintenance of major general, quarterly and annual income taxes, monthly financial statements and development of an accounting procedures manual.

Programming

Payroll Processing

It includes: Establishment of a system to administer and compile hours worked data (work reporting system). Payroll processing and print employee paychecks. Conflict Resolution Center

What is the Conflict Resolution Center (CRC) of the Puerto Rico Chamber of Commerce?

The use of the mediation and arbitration are effective forms to alleviate the tight calendar of the courts in our country. The fast pace of today's business world deems it necessary to create expeditious formulas to solve conflicts that are generated in the relations of commercial interchange. For these reasons, in many jurisdictions businessmen have found in mediation and arbitration the most effective and efficient mechanisms to solve their conflicts. Hence, the Puerto Rico Chamber of Commerce has implemented mechanisms of mediation and arbitration through a forum (CRC), to help decide in a flexible, economic and fast way the commercial conflicts of its partners, including the ones from the general public before mediators or impartial referees.

What is mediation?

Mediation is the process in which people can resolve their controversies. Through dialog and with the aid of an impartial mediator, each of the parties in a dispute have the opportunity to present and or display their opinion on the conflict and to participate voluntarily to obtain a mutually satisfactory agreement.

What is arbitration?

Arbitration provides an equal opportunity to the parties involved to present and or display their positions, theories and evidence in a adjudicative procedure which is faster and more reliable than a judicial one. This procedure concludes with the emission of an award in which it resolves the totality of the controversies and issues presented to the referee. The parties have the option to decide whether or not to undergo this procedure which is undisputable.

Some Advantages of Mediation and Arbitration:




FAST: Allows solutions in less time due to the speed of its process and development.



IMPARTIALITY: Both parties are guaranteed to be treated with impartiality by the excellent referees and mediators recruited by the Puerto Rico Chamber of Commerce, hence the ruling will be just. The parties involved may decide from a registry of mediators and referees to a neutral third option.



LOW-COST: Mediation and arbitrage are relatively less expensive than a judicial process.





Lobbying and Legislative Action

Lobbying

The Puerto Rico Chamber of Commerce is the premiere private sector organization in Puerto Rico that has the most presence in the Puerto Rico Legislative Assembly and the United States Congress, given that it represents all business sectors in the island. Its leadership in the entrepreneurial community is upheld by the value to its members of the lobbying activities as a basic service for protecting and defending the interests of all sectors, not only in Puerto Rico but in the U.S. Congress as well. It is also the private sector organization most consulted by legislative committees with regard to measures submitted for their consideration.

As a general standard the Puerto Rico Chamber of Commerce assumes its position regarding a legislative bill after evaluating its impact on the economy and commerce, without overlooking the social and cultural impact on he Puerto Rican community. This is done while maintaining itself apart from partisan-politics. Our achievements demonstrate that the Puerto Rico Chamber of Commerce has been highly effective in identifying legislation that would be damaging to the entrepreneurial community prior to becoming law, by means of careful evaluation, submission of analyses to the legislative bodies and, finally, lobbying against approval. In addition, by means of the Working Committees the Puerto Rico Chamber of Commerce offers its members the opportunity to express their ideas on legislative measures that are needed to promote the socioeconomic welfare of our country.

The dissemination of information to the membership regarding the progress of legislation pending consideration by the legislative bodies is made possible by means of our institutionalpublication, "Cámara en Acción" ("Chamber in Action"). The Health Plan for Chamber of Commerce Partners



As a partner of the Chamber of Commerce of Puerto Rico (CCPR) you will have access to different health coverage services that provide medical, hospital, dental, pharmacy and life insurance coverage.

Coverage for Businesses

There are two options provided exclusively for business. The options include: individual, couple and family coverage. You can offer health plan alternatives to suit your employees needs.

Individual Coverage

As an individual you may also benefit from a health plan coverage. You can choose between individual, couple or family coverage. The enrollment period starts now until the end of July 2010. If you apply latter than the enrollment

period, some conditions to qualify may apply.

Registration Documents and Basic Requirements

Current CCPR Partners:

- 1. Have partners dues up to date
- 2. Request a letter of certification from CCPR indicating partner status to be set to Fulcro Insurance Brokers who will process the health plan admission

New CCPR Partners:

- 1. Complete an entry form with member fees included

Insurance Plans

The Puerto Rico Chamber of Commerce also enables its members to obtain a wide selection of insurance products for safeguarding the assets of their businesses and effectively securing possible risks. This service is coordinated through Bonnet Insurance Brokerage Corporation, an insurance brokerage firm that was established forty-five years ago, and is licensed by the Office of the Insurance Commissioner of Puerto Rico to sell all types of insurance and bonds. The corporation is also authorized to sell Excess Line Insurance which permits access to all the world insurance markets when there is no market in Puerto Rico for a particular risk. As the official broker of the Puerto Rico Chamber of Commerce, the corporation offers bona fide members of the Chamber free consulting service.

Working Committes

The Puerto Rico Chamber of Commerce carries out its daily work consulting problems and situations that directly or indirectly affect the private sector of the economy with the Working Committees. The function of the working committees in this effort is of vital importance, so that not only the Executive Committee but also the Board of Directors and the President can receive counsel and advice from the various business sectors. This allows the organization to submit necessary proposals to the corresponding authorities.

All members of the Puerto Rico Chamber of Commerce and their designated representatives are eligible to form part of the Working Committee of their choice. The President of the Puerto Rico Chamber of Commerce will designate the chairpersons of every Committee, who will occupy their position for one year, and will inform them of matters that will constitute the work agenda and priorities for the fiscal year.

Chair persons will concentrate their efforts on these priorities and will recruit volunteer resources in order to facilitate the culmination of their agenda during the fiscal year. If culmination is not possible in that time period, they will submit pertinent recommendations at the end of their terms in order to allow proper continuity of such efforts in subsequent fiscal years.

Chairpersons of the Working Committees may submit additional recommendations at any time during the year in order to add to the work plan, provided they are accompanied with adequate justification defining the problem or matter that the chair deems worthy of consideration, the solutions to be offered and the benefit to be produced.

Included herein is a short list of some of the guidelines for the Working Committees:



Working Committees will act as advisory bodies to the President of the Puerto Rico Chamber of Commerce and the Board of Directors.



Working Committees will have the right to use the physical facilities of the Puerto Rico Chamber of Commerce free of charge in order to carry out their official meetings provided they are requested ahead of time.



Scheduling of the Working Committees will be carried out through the Puerto Rico Chamber of Commerce.



Membership in the Working Committees is renewed annually.

Federal Communications Commission

The Federal Communications Commission (FCC) has created the National Do Not Call Registration, which will soon prohibit people or entities, including Chambers of Commerce and Associations, from sending you any communications by fax that contain promotional materials, without previously having received written consent from you. This prohibitionapplies even if the parties have a business relationship, such as exists between the Puerto Rico Chamber of Commerce (PRCC) and its members. Our fax mailings have been affected due to this new regulation of the FCC. The definition of Promotions Not Requested quite wide. It includes: any types of commercial promotions, quality, property, goods, and services. The FCC indicates that this definition includes conference reminders, seminars, membership renewals and new product announcements, among other things. As you know, the Puerto Rico Chamber of Commerce uses fax and email to keep you informed of announcements that are of interest to you and/or may affect your membership. Our Puerto Rico Chamber of Commerce will not be able to send you any faxes or emails that could contain promotions unless you provide us with a written consent, granting us permission to send you the aforementioned information.
