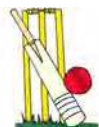

Fees Policy Extract

\$70 per child per day (included in this fee is the excursion fee to cover the cost of excursion venue entry fees, transport cost and on some days lunch).

Families are required to pay in full on enrolment, as places are limited to 20 children per day. Once booked we are unfortunately unable to transfer or cancel bookings or refund fees paid for absent days.

Transport/Excursions policy extract

At Holy Rosary OSHC we may plan excursions to complement the program being offered at our service. Excursions are carefully planned and potential risks are identified and managed accordingly. Excursions will only be conducted to venues after a risk assessment has been completed and the level of risk has been determined as appropriate for the children attending.

Sun Safety policy extract

All enrolled children and employees attending our service shall be protected as far as practicable from skin damage caused by harmful ultra violet radiation (UVR) through the implementation of a mixture of personal and environmental strategies.

Children are to bring sun safe hats each day when attending the service. Parents will be asked to supply sunscreen, this sunscreen must be at least SPF30+.
