## Letters to Father Christmas

This week in literacy the children have been using their fantastic phonics skills to write Christmas lists. We encouraged the children to stretch the words to help them segment the sounds for writing. Father Christmas sent us a message to inform us that his post arrives in the North Pole very wet and soggy because it is getting caught in lots of snow storms. He explained that this is making it very difficult for him to read the Children's wish lists. The children began to think of ways to solve the problem and collectively we decided to experiment with different materials that would survive the snowstorm!

We encouraged the children to explore and test tin foil, paper, plastic and fabric by exposing them to ice and water. The test was to find out which material kept the letters dry....
