Dear Friends,

Even though it seems like we have barely gotten all of the Christmas decorations taken down and put away, February 10th begins the season of Lent. It is that 40 day journey to Easter where we have the wonderful opportunity to reflect and think about the power of the cross of Jesus Christ. Now is the time to think about how this Lent will be meaningful for you – how you will draw closer to God – what things you will do or practice that will set aside this period as sacred and holy.

The church will be offering many opportunities for you to be active and involved during Lent. All of these practices fit right in with our vision statement of "Accept...Grow... Share." There is a special devotional book that will be available called "Living Lent." According to the devotion, "these daily devotions remind us that Lent is a time to ponder and proclaim the fact that after every Good Friday in our lives, there is always an Easter, because Christ has risen. As people of the resurrection, we already know how it all turns out, so that makes 'living Lent' a different experience for us as we retrace Christ's steps to the cross during this holy season, fully aware that Easter has already come to pass." What I really appreciate about this devotion is that it challenges us to do something to "live Lent." If you engage with the devotional, please let me know how you personally live Lent this year.

There will also be additional times for worship during Lent. As part of the River Churches, we will gather every Wednesday evening at 7pm during Lent (beginning with Ash Wednesday) for worship and fellowship. These services have always been very meaningful and powerful for those who attend. Please see the schedule in the Olive Branch for locations.

Finally, for those who want to "try out" some practices you may have never tried before, I will be offering "Contemplative Wednesdays" from 6-7pm. For $\frac{1}{2}$ hour, you will learn a contemplative spiritual practice and get to experience it. For the other $\frac{1}{2}$ hour, you have the opportunity to spent time in silence and prayer. Again, the schedule for these are in this edition of the Olive Branch.

My hope and prayer for you is a sacred and holy Lent where you experience Christ in a new and real way.
