## **Award & Category Selection Criteria**

### Business and Innovation >10 FTE

The Business (>10 FTE) award winner will demonstrate their business' place in the new sustainability led economy. They will show reductions in environmental impact (energy, materials, waste, and/or water) and/or sustainability enhancements to products/services and/or their plan for a sustainable future.

### Business and Innovation <10 FTE</p>

The Business (<10FTE) award winner will demonstrate their business' place in the new sustainability led economy. They will show reductions in environmental impact (energy, materials, waste, and/or water) and/or sustainability enhancements to products/services and/or their plan for a sustainable future.

### Home and Garden

The Home and Garden award winner will demonstrate reductions in environmental impact (water, waste and/or energy use) and/or sustainable design/construction. Nominees may also show a commitment to sharing and teaching others to carry out sustainable residential projects.

### Community Award

The Community Award is open to individuals, community groups and organisations who have nurtured projects, programs and/or partnerships that have contributed to sustainability in Bendigo. Projects could include, but are not limited to habitat creation, protection or enhancement on public or private land and community programs that encourage others to take part in sustainable projects.

### **Education Early Childhood/Primary**

The Early Childhood/Primary Education Award (including childcare, kinder programs, primary schools) winner will demonstrate a passion for inspiring the next generation. They will demonstrate reductions in environmental impact (water, waste and/or energy use) and/or an increase in local biodiversity and/or an integrated environmental education program.

### **Education Secondary/ Tertiary**

The Secondary/Tertiary Education Award (including Tafe, university and secondary schools) winner will demonstrate a passion for inspiring the next generation. They will demonstrate reductions in environmental impact (water, waste and/or energy use) and/or an increase in local biodiversity and/or an integrated environmental education program.

## **Judging Process**

All nominations submitted by the closing date will be judged by a panel of three judges. If further information is required for judging purposes, a panel representative/s may contact, visit and or take additional photos via arrangement. If it is felt your nomination is better suited to a different category to the one you have entered the judges reserve the right to move your entry to the appropriate category for judging.

The Judges' decision is final and no correspondence will be entered into.

#### **Selection Criteria:**

- The project has occurred within the City of Greater Bendigo
- All nominations must be received on the Bendigo Sustainability Awards nomination form
- Judges will give precedence to projects that have occurred within the last two years

#### **Sustainable Business and Innovation Award**

The Sustainable Business and Innovation Award (>10 FTE and <10 FTE) recognise Bendigo businesses who demonstrate innovative and sustainable practices. Any single product, service or activity that demonstrates innovation and sustainability may be nominated.

- Must be able to demonstrate reductions in environmental impact, for example reduction in water, waste and/or energy use and/or impacts on biodiversity.
- Carried out a voluntary initiative that has had a positive outcome for the environment e.g. conservation of native vegetation, community education, financial contributions allowing others to carry out sustainable projects.
- Sustainability enhancements/innovations to products/services &/or their plan for a sustainable future. For example, installation of renewable energy systems, edible gardens within the workplace, reducing energy and water consumption, use of Fair Trade certified products and development of a new product or service with sustainability features.

#### **Home and Garden Award**

The Home and Garden Award recognises Bendigo residents who have carried out projects around their home and garden that increase the sustainability of the home and/or garden.

- Demonstrate reductions in environmental impact and/or sustainability thinking in design/construction. Examples may include but are not limited to reduction in water, waste and/or energy use, developed an innovative and creative food garden or created native habitat through protection, regeneration or improvement on a domestic block.
- A residential property within the City of Greater Bendigo.
- Initiatives undertaken as a purely private non-commercial nature.
- May include sharing knowledge to inspire others to carry out sustainability projects.
- Other example may include common and/or unusual edible species including vegetables, herbs, flowers, bush foods, fruit and nut trees; traditional and/or innovative methods such as no dig, raised beds, hanging baskets, containers and vertical systems; permaculture systems such as creating compost, worm farms and poultry; reduction in town water use; habitat creation, enhancing local ecosystems to improve biodiversity.





#### **Community Award**

The Community Award recognises the work of local Bendigo individuals, community groups or organisations that have nurtured projects, programs and/or partnerships that have contributed to sustainability in Bendigo.

- Demonstrate activities that contribute to economic, social and environmentally sustainable communities within the City of Greater Bendigo.
- Leadership in the delivery of a project that enhances the longterm sustainability of Bendigo's built or natural environment. Creating partnerships between local residents, community groups and/or organisations.
- A reduction in the overall impact on the environment as a result of the individual and/or group's activities.
- Other practices demonstrating innovation, creativity and resourcefulness that contributes to improved sustainability.
  Example may include working bees on public land; communicating a sustainable message; regeneration work such as planting, rubbish removal, fencing and/or connecting with community and involving local community in the project.

#### **Education Awards**

The Education Awards recognises Bendigo Early Childhood/ Primary (including childcare and kinder programs) and Secondary/Tertiary (including Tafe, university and adult education institutions) who have implemented any single initiative or activity that has achieved sustainability outcomes.

- A project that demonstrates sustainability. For example reduction of resource use by reducing water, waste and/or energy use; increase/enhance biodiversity; raise awareness of a local environmental issue.
- Student participation in planning, implementing and evaluating the sustainability initiative and inspiring students to have a passion for sustainability.
- Involvement of the wider community in the sustainability initiative. For example, parents, community groups, organisations and businesses.
- Measurement of the success of the sustainability initiative. For example, kilos of vegetables grown, number of students involved, percentage of waste diverted from landfill.
