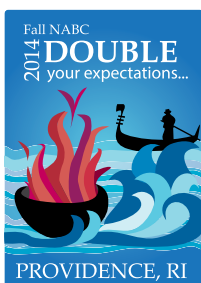

## Volunteers honored at Goodwill meeting

The ACBL Goodwill Committee was created in 1955 and renamed for its longest-tenured chair, Aileen Osofsky, after her death in 2010. She served as chair for 25 years and entered the ACBL Bridge Hall of Fame as the 2009 recipient of the Blackwood Award – for long service to the game without necessarily being a world-class player.

The Aileen Osofsky Goodwill Committee convenes on the first Monday of every NABC so that the members can strengthen their resolve to spread goodwill beyond the committee. The goal: making bridge fun for everyone at all times.

When Robert Hartman, ACBL's chief executive, was called upon by Goodwill Chair Sandy DeMartino to address the crowd, he said, "Of all the events I speak at, this is my favorite. You are friends of the game and great ambassadors. Thanks for all you do."

After welcoming everyone, DeMartino announced that Eddie Kantar was selected by the ACBL Board of Directors as the Honorary Member of the Year. "We couldn't believe he didn't already have the award," she said, "and we found that he does an incredible amount of work in his district."

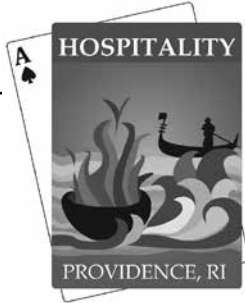

### Restaurant specials

The following restaurants are offering additional deals to the ones listed in the Providence Schedule & Restaurant Guide with the presentation of a convention card.

**Shula's 347 Grill**, located in the Hilton, is offering 10% off all salads and sandwiches from noon to 3 p.m. Also, players can enjoy a glass of any varietal of Rhode Island's Jamestown Vineyard wine for just \$4.

**The Dorrance** (60 Dorrance St., Downtown) offers bridge players a special three-course dinner menu for \$35. The offer is good for diners who arrive between 5 and 6 p.m. (The restaurant opens promptly at 5 p.m.) The Dorrance promises quick service, allowing players to finish dinner in less than 90 minutes.

### Parking Information

Discounted parking is available at the RI Convention Center Garage. **The discounted daily rate for parking from 7 a.m. to midnight is just \$8. Players must obtain a parking discount voucher (worth \$4) at the Registration Desk in the lobby or the NABC Shirt Sales Desk outside Exhibition Hall C. This voucher must be used when exiting the garage and will reduce the parking fee from the normal event rate of \$12 to the discounted rate of \$8.** The overnight rate at the Convention Center Garage is \$18 per 24-hour period. Discount vouchers **cannot** be used for overnight parking.

### Convention card reminder

Each player is required to have a convention card filled out legibly and on the table throughout a session. The convention card must include the first and last name of each member of the partnership, and the cards must be identical.

If a director determines that neither player has a substantially completed card, the partnership may play only the Standard American Yellow Card and may use only standard carding. This restriction may be lifted only at the beginning of a subsequent round after convention cards have been properly prepared and approved by the director. Further, the partnership will receive a 1/6-board matchpoint penalty for each board played, commencing with the next round and continuing until the restriction is lifted. In IMP team games, penalties shall be at the discretion of the director.

If the director determines the partnership has at least one substantially completed convention card but has not fully complied with ACBL regulations, the director may give warnings or assign such penalties as he deems to be appropriate under the circumstances.

The objective of these warnings and penalties is the encouragement of full compliance with ACBL regulations.

### Check cashing and Bridge Bucks

Players will be able to cash checks and purchase Bridge Bucks daily through Saturday, Dec. 6, between 12 p.m. and 1 p.m. outside Ball Room A on the fifth floor of the convention center. You may use a credit card to purchase Bridge Bucks.

### Use of the Bidding Box — Alerts and Announcements

When using bidding boxes, the ACBL requires that players tap the Alert strip and say "Alert" at the same time.

When making an Announcement, use the Announcement word (such as "transfer") and tap the Alert strip at the same time.

A player who Alerts or Announces a bid must make sure his opponents are aware that an Alert or Announcement has been made.

## Common errors and how to avoid them

### Poor signaling, Part 3

In the following situation, you are East.

♠ 4 2  
♥ 9 5 3  
♦ K Q J 9 5  
♣ 8 4 2

♠ K 10 7  
♥ Q 7 6  
♦ A 8 2  
♣ 9 6 5 3

West	North	East	South

West, your partner, leads the ♠6. You put up the king and South wins with the ♠A. Declarer's next move is to play the ♦10. Partner follows with a low card and it's your turn to play. Now what?

Do you win the ace and fire back a spade? Play low? The answer can be found in the card partner played at trick two. In this situation, it is vital for partner to give a count signal so you know what to do.

You know you have to play a low diamond at least once. Declarer's opening guaranteed at least two cards in every suit, so you cannot consider winning the ace on the first round of the suit. Declarer would then have four diamond tricks.

Okay, so perhaps you should play your ♦A on the second round. Well, that would be no good if declarer started with three diamonds. He would still have one left and would end up with four tricks in the suit.

If declarer started with only two diamonds, however, you must play your ace at trick two because a second diamond trick might be all South needs to make his game (he has indicated a strong hand, after all).

You may be thinking, "Wow! That's confusing. How will I ever know what to do?" You will know because partner will give you a signal telling you how many diamonds he has and therefore how many South has.

If partner's diamond holding is 7-6, he will play the 7 – high-low to indicate an even number of cards. If it's 7-6-3, he will play the 3 (low-high from an odd number) and you will know declarer started with just two diamonds. You can limit him to one trick in the suit by playing low at trick two and the ace at trick three. If partner has a singleton diamond, declarer has four of them, so you can't keep declarer from setting up the suit and getting to it.

**Opening lead:** ♦A – ace from A-K-x-(x) at trick one vs. suit contracts.

**Bidding commentary:** Those who play 2/1 forcing to game might jump to 4♠ with the North hand after the raise to 3♣. This follows the concept of going slower to show a better hand and leaving room for slam exploration.

Those who do not play 2/1 would use the diagrammed bidding, where 3♠ (delayed support at the three level) is forcing.

**Defensive commentary:** When signaling encouragement using standard carding, encourage with the highest spot card you can afford, in this case the 10. Signaling with the 9 would deny the 10. It may not matter on this deal, but it does matter in many, many cases. Be careful when signaling encouragement with "equal" spot cards.

**Further defensive commentary:** After East's encouraging signal with the 10, West continues with the ♦K and ♦J. East overtakes the jack with the queen. Can you see why? Read on.

In order for South to have an opening bid, he must have all of the missing honor cards, ♠A Q, the ♥A, the ♣K and probably the ♠J as well. If so, how are you going to beat this contract?

**Go back to old faithful:** When there are no further tricks coming from the side suits (hearts and clubs), think ruff-sluff! If you lead your fourth diamond and partner inserts the ♠7, driving out dummy's ♠10, your ♠K 9 8 will produce a defensive trick for down one. All you have to do is cover the ♠J if it is led.

## Edgar Kaplan Blue Ribbon Pairs

The Edgar Kaplan Blue Ribbon Pairs ranks with the von Zedtwitz Life Master Pairs (and now the new Platinum Pairs in the spring) as one of the most prestigious — and toughest — pair events on the ACBL calendar. Like the LM Pairs and Platinum Pairs, the Blue Ribbon Pairs is played over three days and includes two qualifying, two semifinal and two final sessions.

Entry is restricted to winners and runners-up in regional championships — plus high finishers in North American championships, members of current Grand National district championship teams, members of current official teams representing ACBL and the top 100 lifetime masterpoint holders.

The Blue Ribbon Pairs was renamed the Edgar Kaplan Blue Ribbon Pairs in 1999 to honor one of bridge's all-time great players, writers, administrators and the authority on the laws of the game.

Kaplan (1925-1997) won his first North American championship in 1953 — the Vanderbilt — and his last in 1997 — the Open Swiss Teams at the Spring NABC in Dallas.

Kaplan was recognized as the world's foremost authority on the laws of duplicate and rubber bridge. He became co-chairman of the ACBL Laws Commission in 1978 and was co-chairman of the WBF Laws Commission at the time of his death.

He was named ACBL Honorary Member in 1993. In 1995 he was inducted into the ACBL Bridge Hall of Fame and the WBF Hall of Fame.

The event is contested for the Cavendish Trophy, awarded for the National Open Pair Championship and donated by the Cavendish Club of New York in 1928. Since 1963, the trophy has been awarded to winners of the Blue Ribbon Pairs.

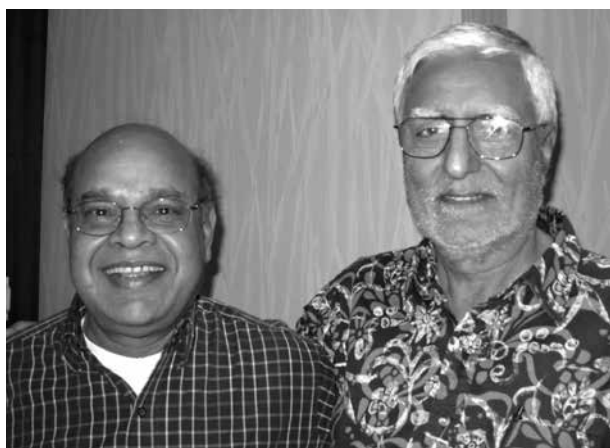

A look at all four hands would have guided Rodwell to the killing lead of a low spade to his partner's king, followed by a club for Rodwell to ruff. He would still have the ♥K coming. Meckstroth and Rodwell are an aggressive pair, so they are familiar with “live by the sword etc.” The defense was deadly accurate. Chambers led the ♠8 and Schermer won with the king, cashed the ace and gave his partner a spade ruff. A heart to the ace was followed by a fourth round of spades, Meckstroth and Chambers discarding diamonds. The defense already had four tricks in with three trump tricks to come. Three down meant plus 800 and a potential big swing to Kasle.

As you can see, a diamond lead would have resulted in plus 200 for East-West – good for a 14-IMP swing to Kasle – but on the uninformative auction, Kozlove had no reason to reject the normal lead of the ♠J. That gave Bramley the chance he needed.

He won the ♣A, cashed the ♥A, happy to see both opponents follow (meaning a maximum of two trump losers) then cashed his top two spades and ruffed a spade to get to dummy. Bramley discarded one diamond on the ♠K and another on the ♣Q. He then ruffed dummy's last club to hand and played his last spade, ruffing when East discarded.

Bramley lost two hearts and a diamond but had his game in hand for plus 620. It was a 5-IMP loss, but when the final board of the overtime ended up as a push, Gupta was through to the semifinal round with a 154-149 victory.

## Electronic Device Policy

The electronic device policy at NABCs allows players to bring electronic devices such as cell phones into the playing area provided that such devices are turned off.

Further, any such equipment must not be visible during the session

The policy applies to all pairs, team members, captains, coaches, kibitzers and play recorders, except those designated by the ACBL and are in force throughout any actual playing session or segment of play.

A violation of the policy will result in an automatic disciplinary penalty of one full board (or 12 IMPs at that form of scoring) for the first offense. A second offense will result in disqualification from the event for the pair/team. Kibitzers violating this policy will be removed from the playing area for the remainder of the session.

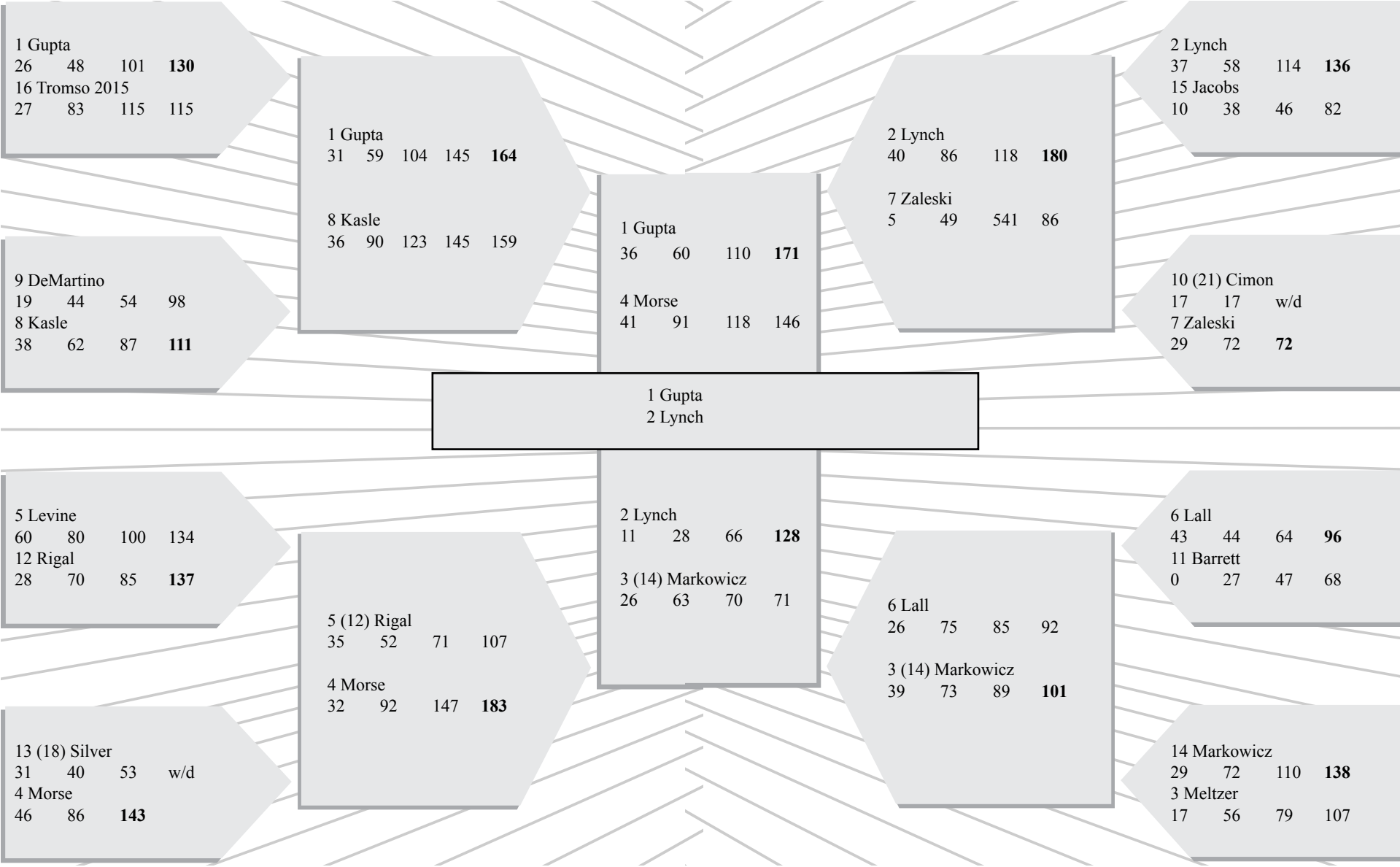

Halfway through the match with the Dan Morse team, Gupta was on the wrong side of a 91-60 score. Gupta won the third set 50-27 to get to within 8 IMPs, then won the fourth quarter 61-28 to advance, 171-146.

Lynch’s win was even more impressive. Down 35 at the halfway point against the Victor Markowicz team, Lynch closed the gap to 4 IMPs then and blitzed their opponents 62-1 in the fourth quarter to win 128-71.

“I played the accompanying hand last night against the chieftains of the local tribes,”Cuthbert wrote. “I ruffed the first heart with the ♠J and saw that I could make the slam if I found the ♦Q or if the club finesse worked. The odds were slightly better than three to one in my favor.”

Then, he wrote, he saw that the slam was unbeatable if the trumps broke 2-2. He took the ♠A, led a spade to the 10 and ruffed dummy’s other heart. The trumps had broken favorably, and he was about to make the slam. Little did he know what a terrible risk he was running.

He led a diamond to the king and returned a diamond. East followed and Cuthbert finessed.

The finesse assured the slam. If West had the ♦Q he would be endplayed. A club return would give Cuthbert a free finesse; a heart return would let him ruff in his hand and discard a club from dummy. In any case, he would discard a club from
