
## Congratulatíons

The competition involved teams of four sitting around a desk solving as many problems as they could in 30 minutes. Each team had a runner whose job was to collect questions. Once a team had the answer they then sent the runner back to the judges, and either got a *Yes* and 5 points, or a *No*. The latter meant the runner had to return to their team to try and solve the problem again. Teams were allowed to *pass* on a question after two attempts. We should all be incredibly happy with the way our teams performed not just academically, but also in the manner in which they carried
