#### Song Magic Week 1 Report by Ruth Nolan

I really enjoyed today's introductory session with a number of students taking part.

It was great to work with Aunty Shaa. We put the Gumbaynggirr phrase 'Ngarraanga jili la' to the Nanooma chant, with 'Youwey eh-ah' instead of 'wy-yi-ay-o.'

Ngarraanga means to hear and understand and remember. (In our Song Magic workshop, this requires a special magical kind of listening, so that we might hear the secret song of the land and the trees and maybe learn their names and their story.) And 'jili la' makes the phrase mean 'Let's keep hearing (understanding and remembering.)' We want to listen so we can hear the Land tell us. Listening to Country, to hear, to understand and to remember.

We also had some breathing exercises, some body percussion, some vocal warm ups, some drumming, some imagination directed at listening, body awareness and grounding, lots of stepping in time and some stop/start conductor response training. One of the students was still feeling unwell, so we experimented with making soothing humming sounds around him. This experiment was enthusiastically taken up, with others wanting a turn at being in the middle to receive the sounds.

#### Walking with India and Pip by Grace


- I hear Pip's little footsteps and our giggles.
