2. A transcript of academic records in Finnish or English. The transcript does not need to be official, it is possible to send it in pdf format from NettiOpsu to your own e-mail address and then print it out as an enclosure.
3. A motivation letter and study plan at the host university in English. A study plan is required for each of the universities you apply to. List the subjects you wish to study and the courses you already know of. Familiarise yourself with the ISEP and university websites. Give reasons for your interest in the country and the subjects/ courses in question. This is one of the most important sections in your application.
4. Master's degree programme students (only those students taking a separate two-year Master's programme; not those students studying towards an 'ordinary' Master's degree): a statement from the supervisor of the Master's thesis in which the supervisor supports your application to a given host university (how the exchange period would contribute to writing your Master's thesis or how you would otherwise benefit from this period, e.g. which qualifications required for your degree you would be able to acquire while studying abroad).
