Post - 9/11 GI Bill (Chapter 33)

The Post - 9/11 GI Bill is a new education benefit program for individuals who served on active duty on or after September 11, 2001. Post - 9/11 GI Bill benefits are payable for training pursued on or after August 1, 2009. No payments can be made under this benefit for training before that date.

Note: Once you elect to receive benefits under the Post - 9/11 GI Bill (Chapter 33), you will no longer be eligible to receive benefits under your previous program (Chapter 30, 1606 and/or 1607). The election to use Chapter 33 benefits is an irrevocable election and must be in writing from the individual.

Individuals who elect to use the Post - 9/11 GI Bill (Chapter 33) benefits <u>must</u> complete a new application (22-1990) available beginning May 1, 2009. *Be sure to elect 9F. Chapter 33 Election under Part II - Education Benefit being applied for.* The 22-1990 can be submitted in two (2) ways:

- Click on the link provided to submit the 22-1990 on-line http://vabenefits.vba.va.gov/vonapp/main.asp directly to the VA. Instructions for filling out applications are provided on this website.
- Click on the link provide to complete the 22-1990 (fillable format) <u>Applications\22-1990.pdf</u>. Once the information is filled in, print the 22-1990, sign, date and mail the 22-1990 with a member-4 copy of the DD-214 to the following address for the Southern Region (serves Alabama):

The 22-1990 <u>must</u> be processed by the VA before an individual can use the benefit at Shelton State Community College. Once your 22-1990 is approved by the VA, you will receive a letter stating the percentage of benefits that you are eligible to receive (see table 1 under Basic Eligibility). When you receive this letter, you will need to provide a copy of the letter to Shelton State Community College to begin using your new benefit.

Basic Eligibility

To be eligible, a service member or veteran (honorable discharge) must have served at least 90 aggregate days on active duty*. However, individuals who were honorably discharged for a <u>service-connected disability</u> and who served 30 continuous days after September 10, 2001, may establish eligibility as determined by the Department of Veteran Affairs.

*Excludes time in Basic Military Training and/or Skill Training.

Consider Before You Elect

Before you elect to use the Post - 9/11 GI Bill (Chapter 33) it is recommended that each individual calculate their entitlement. A good tool is the calculator available at http://www.gibill2008.org/calculator.html which gives the individual a comparison of the current benefits and the new benefit.

Benefit Payments

Under the Post - 9/11 GI Bill (Chapter 33), the individual may receive:

- Tuition and fees
- Book stipend up to \$1000 per academic year
 - o \$41.67 per credit hour
 - o Up to 24 credit hours in a single academic year
 - Lump sum payment (each semester attended) paid directly to the individual until book stipend exhausted for the academic year
 - o Active duty members are not eligible
- Monthly housing allowance (BAH)
 - Amount determined by the zip code of the college/university where the student is enrolled. For Shelton State Community College students, the zip code is 35405 and the calculated BAH is currently \$1094. Click here for the BAH for colleges/universities in the State of Alabama: <u>BAH</u> for Chapter 33.pdf
 - o BAH payments are paid directly to the eligible person on a monthly basis
 - o Active duty members are not eligible
 - o Individuals training at $\frac{1}{2}$ time (6 credit hours) or less is not eligible
 - o Individuals pursuing training solely by distance learning (online classes) are not eligible

All benefit payments are prorated based on the percentage of the individual's payment tier (i.e.: 40% to 100%). See table 1 under Basic Eligibility.

Additional Resources for Information
