## Chesapeake College Emerging Scholars Program

Emerging Scholars is a special program designed for 2008 high school graduates who would like to get a jump start on college during the Summer of 2008. The program is 8 weeks in length and offers students an opportunity to complete developmental courses and be college-ready by the Fall 2008 semester. Students must be registered by June 5, 2008 in order to participate in the program. Enrollment is limited to a maximum of 40 students. Completion of the application does not guarantee acceptance into the Program.

#### Student eligibility requirements:

- ➤ Be a 2008 high school graduate
- Reside in Caroline, Dorchester, Kent, Queen Anne's, or Talbot county
- Test into one or both of the following developmental courses: ENG 082 (Intermediate Reading & Writing) and/or MAT 031 (Algebra I)
- ➤ Interest in enrolling in ENG 082 and/or MAT 031 and FSC 101 (Freshman Seminar) during the SU08 semester

#### Advantages:

- ➤ Half-price Summer 2008 tuition for Emerging Scholars courses only
- Small classes
- > Full access to academic support services
- ➤ Up to a \$500 scholarship for the Fall 2008 semester (pending successful completion of Summer 2008 courses)

#### Steps to becoming an Emerging Scholar:

- 1. Complete and submit a Chesapeake College admissions application.
- 2. Take the ASA (Academic Skills Assessment).
- 3. Seek academic advisement. If you test into a developmental English (ENG 082) and/or math (MAT 031) course and would like to enroll in one or both courses during the Summer 2008 session, *let the academic advisor know*.
- 4. Complete an Emerging Scholars application at the time you review your test scores with the academic advisor, or mail it to: *Kathy Petrichenko*, *Dean for Recruitment Services*, *Chesapeake College*, *P.O. Box 8*, *Wye Mills*, MD 21679. The application (other side of this form) must be submitted prior to registration.
- 5. You will receive notification of your application status at the time you register for classes or within one business day of receipt.
- 6. If approved for the Program, register for the following Emerging Scholars Summer 2008 classes: ENG 082 and/or MAT 031 and FSC 101.
- 7. Pay 50% of the in-county tuition & fees.
- 8. Attend the Emerging Scholars Orientation session on Monday, June 16, 2008 from 5:30-7 p.m. in the Economic Development Center, Room EDC-27, at Chesapeake College's Wye Mills Campus.
- 9. Purchase textbooks and other needed supplies.
- 10. Go to class.
