#### FROM THE PRINCIPAL Day 8 Enrolments 2016

Last Friday, I submitted our Day 8 Effective Enrolment Return. This year we have started the year with 525 students, as compared with 485 students on Day 8 in 2015. As a result of this increase we have been allocated another class teacher, taking our total class teacher numbers from 21 to 22. We have also received an increase in general teacher aide time of 6.5 hours a week.

This week I will be consulting with parents and teachers in restructuring classes in Years 1, 2 & 3, to form an additional class. I plan to have the arrangements finalised by the end of this week.

#### P&C Association - Annual General Meeting

On Wednesday 17<sup>th</sup> February the P&C Association will be holding its Annual General Meeting, followed by the monthly meeting, commencing at **7 pm** in the meeting room in the hall. At the Annual General Meeting, the P&C executive committee will be elected to positions for the coming year. Nomination forms for positions will be available from the office.

Parents are invited to attend both meetings.

In my Principal's report, at the general meeting, I will be discussing our Investing for Success (formerly Great Results Guarantee) strategies for 2016, as well as the process we will be undertaking in conducting a Full School Review.

#### **Before School Arrangements**

Parents are advised that there are no formal supervision arrangements in place for students who arrive at school before the start of the school day at 8.50am. In the morning, teachers use the time before classes begin to attend meetings, organise resources and prepare the class program.

Students, on arriving at school, should sit and wait in the following areas:

Prep-Year 3 - On the seats, under the top end of B Block

Years 4 – 6 – On the terraced seating, under the Undercover Games Area.

Teacher Aides release students from these areas at 8.45am. They are collected by the class teacher and walked to class.
