9		ii. An Ad Hoc Committee serves for a specified period of time as dictated by the particular conditions, circumstances and events necessitat[ion]ing the formation of a special committee.		
0		iii. The President of the CSSNY shall have the authority to create temporary, ad hoc or special committees to oversee and manage specific issues not covered by any CSSNY standing or permanent committee and to appoint or remove the chair and members thereof, as CSSNY needs dictate without the express permission or approval of the CSSNY Board of Directors. The CSSNY President may seek out the advice of the other Executive Officers or Board members in establishing an Ad Hoc Committee, its members and the appointment of the Chair of the Committee.

3		Standing Committees shall be the permanent committees of the CSSNY established within these bylaws. The Chairperson and members of the Committee shall be appointed by the CSSNY President with input and the approval of the CSSNY Board of Directors.

9		(b) The Committee shall meet with CSSNY staff of retained lobbyists and other consultants, as necessary, to formulate and execute the legislative and governmental agenda of the CSSNY.		
10		(c) The Committee, through CSSNY's staff and legislative counsel, shall monitor the New York state legislative and regulatory processes and make recommendations to the CSSNY Board of Directors concerning the initiation of, support of or opposition to specific pieces of legislation or regulation affecting the practice of chiropractic in New York state and access to chiropractic care and services for benefit plans and services that come within the ambit of state law, rule and regulation.		
11		(d) The Committee shall create and recommend to the CSSNY Board of Directors for approval, and produce programs designed to enlist the support and mobilization of the CSSNY membership that would contribute to the propagation of legislation favorable to chiropractic patients and the profession.		
12		(e) The Committee shall represent the CSSNY in hearings before the state legislature or a committee thereof, and other public agency or governmental bodies, with the consent, input and oversight of the CSSNY President, the official spokesperson for the CSSNY, as the Committee may be requested to do so by the CSSNY Board of Directors and upon the input and advice of the CSSNY staff or retained legislative counsel and other qualified consultants.

4		(b) The Committee shall meet with attorneys, as necessary, to formulate and execute the legal agenda of the CSSNY WITH THE APPROVAL OF THE CSSNY OFFICERS AND BOARD OF DIRECTORS.
5		(c) The Committee shall monitor all state and federal laws, rules and regulations and court decisions affecting the practice of chiropractic in New York state and shall report regularly to the CSSNY Board of Directors and, when necessary, shall review and recommend appropriate legal action, if required.

3		ii.	Revisions and Amendments to the Bylaws
			This Committee shall be responsible for insuring that any and all proposed alterations or amendments to these bylaws shall be placed in their proper organizational, grammatical and parliamentary form upon presentation thereof by the Secretary of the CSSNY within a reasonable time following receipt. Upon consideration thereof, any proposal will be returned to the CSSNY Secretary for consideration by the CSSNY Board of Directors pursuant to ARTICLE of these bylaws.

5		iv.	Ethics, Professional Conduct and Peer Review
			(a) This Committee shall hear entertain and address any and all questions of unprofessional conduct and/or violations of the CSSNY Code of Professional Ethics raised or brought by patients, the public and other CSSNY members, AND/OR THE STATE BOARD FOR CHIROPRACTIC;
6			(b) This Committee shall recommend to the President of the CSSNY the appointment of members to a Board of Inquiry in comportment with ARTICLE of these bylaws whenever grievances have been alleged or charges have been brought against one or more CSSNY members but only insofar as the complaint involves the practice of chiropractic in New York state and poses an imminent danger to the public's health and safety, and/or it involves any purported or potential violation of New York state or federal law, rule or regulation and/or the CSSNY Code of Professional Ethics;

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1			(c) This Committee shall hear and mediate all complaints made in writing by patients and beneficiaries against any CSSNY member and shall recommend to the CSSNY Board of Directors suitable resolution thereof. The Committee shall refer complaints made in writing by patients and beneficiaries against any non-CSSNY member to the State Education Department, Office of Professional Discipline;
2			(d) This Committee shall submit for circulation, articles and announcements as shall contribute to CSSNY members' understanding of issues pertaining to federal and state laws, rules and regulations, legal and litigative matters pertaining to professional ethics, to be published in the CSSNY publications or posted to the CSSNY Website.
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4		[g] h.	Leadership, Nominating and Elections Committee
5		i.	This Committee shall be comprised of the Immediate Past President of the CSSNY (or the Immediate Past President of the constituent organizations comprising the consolidated CSSNY, namely the New York Chiropractic Council (NYCC) and the New York State Chiropractic Association (NYSCA)) and any past presidents of the CSSNY, the Chair of the Rules, Revisions, Policy and Ethics Committee and any other CSSNY members appointed by the President and approved by the CSSNY Board of Directors;
6		ii.	This Committee shall identify and publish criteria for leadership and leadership positions in the CSSNY;
7		iii.	This Committee shall mentor new officers, board and committee members of the CSSNY;
8		iv.	This Committee shall recommend nominees for one or more of the Executive Officer positions to the CSSNY Board of Directors. Individuals selected will be approached to see if they are interested in being nominated for an Officer's position. Nominated candidates will have to submit an "Intent to Run" form, vitae and disclosure forms as required in ARTICLE – Elections;
9		V.	This Committee may present seminars to the membership on leadership development;
10		vi.	This Committee shall submit for circulation, articles and announcements as shall contribute to CSSNY members' understanding of issues pertaining to federal and state laws, rules and regulations, legal and litigative matters concerning Association Management (IRS 1099 filing requirements, federal and state lobbying rules, FTC CAN-SPAM rules, Department of Labor Employee Management issues, etc.), to be published in the CSSNY publications or posted to the CSSNY Website.

1		Other or Additional Duties of Committees
		The CSSNY Board of Directors may direct that one or more CSSNY Standing Committees perform other or additional tasks not listed above, if the assignments are consistent with the Committees overall mission.
2		4. Committee Membership
		All Ad Hoc and Standing Committee meetings are open to the general membership and invited guests. In the event that a Committee must discuss and address information and material of a confidential nature, the Committee may elect to enter into Executive Session which will close the meeting to all except Committee members and invited exceptions. Executive Session does not carry over to the next convocation of the Committee and must be renewed each time the Committee meets, if necessary.
3		5. Reimbursement of Committee Expenses
		Committee members and the chairpersons thereof, may be reimbursed for all reasonable, legitimate and necessary expenses incurred indicate to bona fide meetings of the Committee as CSSNY resources permit, but submitting a voucher, approved in writing by the Committee chair, and submitted to the CSSNY Administrative Office and Treasurer of the CSSNY. Before engaging in any meeting or incurring any expense in the name of the Committee, the Committee chair should check with the CSSNY Treasurer and the CSSNY staff Controller and Finance Director to see if the CSSNY has the resources available to meet the Committee's request. If resources are available, the Committee should make a request for funding submitted through the CSSNY Treasurer to the CSSNY Board of Directors for deliberation and determination.
4		6. Committee Reports
		The chair or vice chair of all Standing or Permanent Committee shall render a written and/or oral report of the Committee's activities at all annual membership meetings and regular meetings of the CSSNY Board of Directors.
5		7. Authority and Power of Committees
		CSSNY Committees are not independent legal entities of the CSSNY. The CSSNY is responsible for all Committee activities and the activities of the chair and vice chair of the Committee in CSSNY Name. This includes any tax liability posed by the CSSNY Committees, including any "unrelated business income tax" (UBIT) and other state and federal taxes that may be due and owed by the CSSNY as a result of any Committee activity or activities. <sup>3</sup> Consequently, the person section to chair (of vice chair) a CSSNY Committee must be responsible, competent and accountable; much MUST keep accurate and complete records of Committee transactions and must furnish the CSSNY Treasurer with records and accounts, and accounting information necessary for the CSSNY to complete and report the Society's transactions to federal and state taxing authorities;

Committees and Certification  The granting of any certification by any CSSNY Standing or Ad Hoc Committees is an honor and a privilege that can create direct and vicarious liability for the CSSNY, consequently, unless specifically granted by the President and CSSNY Board of Directors, no Committee, Committee chair (or vice chair) shall grant certification in any Committee program unless prior approval has been given the Committee by a majority vote of the CSSNY Board of Directors based on written reports and a request for such authority provided the Board by the Committee chair (or vice chair). Since certification is an honor as well as a privilege granted to CSSNY members meeting the qualifications and conditions of certification set by the Committee and approved by the CSSNY Board of directors, certification is also subject to suspension or revocation for cause, which may include, but not be limited to, violations of the CSSNY Code of Professional Ethics addressed in ARTICLE of these bylaws.
