Wooten Wisdom...



The common saying of one
engaging in a pilgrimage is:

“A visitor passes through a place;
the place passes through a pilgrim,”

meaning that a pilgrim goes on the journey expecting
to come out of it a different and changed person.

During my Lenten pilgrimage, I read a book called
Chasing the Divine by Ruth Everhart.

The following is a quote from this book,
going a little deeper into what it means
to be changed by pilgrimage.

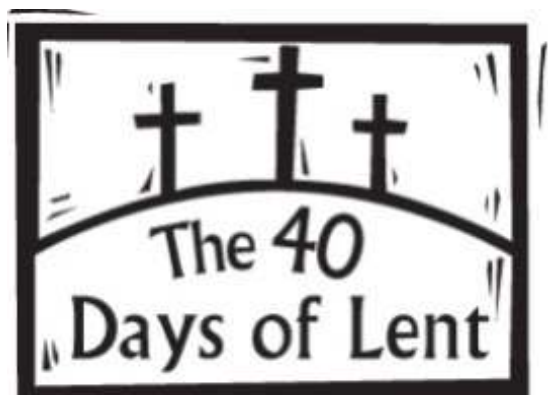
*“There’s something so hands-on about pilgrimage, so
unavoidably tactile. It reminds me of dress shopping
with my daughters. You can look at them all you want
but what you must do is try them on... Sometimes people
say you need to let the dress find you.*

*Pilgrimage takes a similar kind of openness.
Experiencing Jesus is not something we order up but
something we allow to happen. We create the space, the
heart-space, and the Spirit chooses when and how to
appear. We recognize when it happens.*

*The recurring theme in the post-Resurrection stories is
that Jesus appears and disappears.... Jesus seems most
apt to appear when the faithful are together in
conversation, or in prayer, or in breaking bread. We
can do these things, but we cannot command his
appearance. Meanwhile, Jesus is forever moving
forward, inviting us to follow.*

*After all... isn’t the very absence of Jesus, in a sense
beckoning us forward? When Jesus appears and
disappears, doesn’t he encourage us to keep moving
toward him? It’s like stepping toward a light switch in a
dark but familiar room. You know the light is there, so
you keep moving forward even though you can’t quite
see. In a sense, there is no such thing as Jesus’
disappearance; there is only our continual movement
into a new kind of divine presence.” (pages 156-157)*

SESSION MEETING SUMMARY

At its February 19, 2013 meeting, Session...

...welcomed new Ruling Elders, Barbara Wasmer and John Heer.

...held devotion focusing on the ordination question, "will you pray for and seek to serve the people with energy, intelligence, imagination, and love?" We shared our ideas about the meaning of these words. Energy (enthusiasm, excitement, demonstrated passion); Intelligence (take in facts, do research, experience, Biblical values, knowledge); Imagination (creativity, dreaming, visionary, why not approach?, challenge, potential); Love (compassion, respect, acceptance, empathy). Pastor Brandi led us in prayer.

...agreed to hold Season Facilitator training on Wednesday, April 3, 2013.

...noted that Pastor Brandi has been invited to participate in a program sponsored by the Board of Pensions. She will be preparing the required documentation for her attendance May 6-13, 2013.

...approved Lesley Eich's request to be transferred to the Other Participants-Inactive Membership Roll.

...placed the following dates on the master calendar:

February 24: "Chat with Pat" (Jones) after worship

March 10: Chat with Pat (Jones) after worship

March 17: Chicken BBQ

March 24: MS Walk at the Legacy 4 p.m.

March 28: Maundy Thursday potluck supper and worship 6 p.m.

April 3: Season Facilitator Training 12 noon

...continued discussion regarding a worship space for children in the balcony. We discussed purpose, physical space, involving the congregation, preparing the children to learn about worship, preparing children to experience worship from their own space. We agreed to plan a worship experience to occur on May 1, 2013 as part of the Easter Season Christian Education program. We also agreed to ask the Trustees to explore the feasibility of placing a window to the sanctuary in the "junior high room" so parents and children could view worship from above.

...appointed Elder Huffman to serve as Clerk of Session for an open-ended, indeterminate term (which means serving at the will of the Session and/or until the Clerk informs Session that s/he no longer wishes to serve.)

...discussed the Annual Financial Review and the need to have it completed to satisfy Book of Order requirements.

...confirmed the Mission Fund Policy Committee membership as follows:

Trustee Member: Andy Atwater

Congregation Member: Roger Willis

Youth Director: Adam Scoville

Youth Delegate: Abby Wasmer

...approved the minutes of the Annual Meeting of the Congregation held January 27, 2013.

...heard a report from Presbytery Delegate, Elder Harkness. He reported that Presbytery would be voting on Amendments to the Constitution PC/USA Heidelberg Catechism and Amendments to the Book of Order. He also reported on a discernment process used by churches who are considering parting from the Presbytery.

...reviewed the Church Covenant Leadership Agreement. As part of orientation and examination of newly elected officers, Deacons, Session, and Trustees made promises that will inform and direct how we do the ministry we are called to by God. We reviewed and added to the document that Pastor Brandi will finalize and bring to our Boards.

...received the Treasurer's Report for the month ending January 31, 2013.

No Strings Attached

It is March, and we are now into Lent – a time when we prepare for Easter, and remember all the amazing things Jesus did for us. It is a time when many Christians sacrifice (give up) something earthly to remember that God comes first over all, and can sustain us.

When thinking about Lent, I am reminded of the story of Sodom and Gomorrah in the book of Genesis. Sodom and Gomorrah were rich cities which Lot (Abraham's brother-in-law) lived in. The cities had everything, and could be compared to our present day Las Vegas. But the people were evil! With riches came corruption. Some even believe that the code in these cities was to be overly cruel to visitors.

God told Abraham that he was going to destroy the city, but that Lot and his family would be spared. God sent angels to Lot that told him to get out of the city immediately and not to look back! But Lot lingered. These angels would eventually drag him and his family out of the city to safety. And as the city was destroyed, Lot's wife turned to look back on all she had and she turned to a pillar of salt.

I find this story fascinating. God told her to walk away and not look back – to trust God completely in the future – yet Lot's wife didn't want to let go or even forget all that she wanted and loved. And because she did not obey, and couldn't let go, she was punished.

Now how far away are we from being Lot's wife? We yearn for control, security, money, riches, and stuff. We covet others' things and want to get our own way. It would be very hard to let go of things that we think make us better -- to trust God.

This can be seen in people with addictions. For those who struggle to quit smoking, yet cannot permanently let go of the habit. They may have a great life, but the cost of smoking causes pain in the family as finances are struggling. The person tries to quit, and may be temporarily successful, but eventually falls back into it again and again. I consider these different parts of life like strings that are attached to us or strings that we hold

onto. Now if a smoker feels they need to let go of a string, they can try, and simply let go of the string. But if smoking is deeply rooted in them, the string may be attached to them, and they may linger or turn back again and again.

Now Satan knows our weaknesses. When you feel God saying, "this isn't right, walk away" do we linger or turn our backs on God? In our smoker example, it isn't always that easy. Same goes for Lot's wife.

I believe part of Lent is saying to God, "I am not going to let anything in this world control me. God is #1 in my life." And then not only saying this, but living it wholeheartedly. No turning back for a glimpse of the old life.

It is definitely easier said than done. As we seek God in this Lenten journey, I hope that you will find the things in your life that are keeping you from God, and that you let go of those strings and find new life in Christ.

Easter Season:

“Rejoice, Renew, Respond”
