**Parish Registration** - We extend a welcome to all new members of our parish family. We ask all parishioners to welcome and invite new neighbors and their families to become a part of Curé of Ars. Parish Registration booklets are available in the Rectory and at the doors of the Church. Once completed, please submit your form to the Rectory so we can finalize your registration process. You will receive a visit from a Parish Welcoming Committee member shortly thereafter.

**Baptism** - Parents wishing to present a child for Baptism should be registered members of Curé of Ars Parish. Parents are required to have a Baptism Preparation Interview with a member of the Pastoral Team and attend a Baptism Class. Please call the Rectory for an appointment. Baptisms usually take place on the first and third Sundays of the month from 2:30pm - 3:30pm.

**Marriage** - Those wishing to be married in Curé should consult with a member of the Pastoral Team before any other arrangements are made. A minimum of six months is needed for marriage preparation. Pre-Cana and FOCCUS are required for all couples. Weddings may be scheduled on Fridays at 5:30pm (or an agreed upon time), on Saturdays at 11:15am, 1:00pm or 2:30pm and Sundays at 4:00pm.

**Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA)** - An ongoing process of formation for those who ever wonder if they should become "Catholic". If interested please call for a meeting with a member of the Pastoral Team.

**Reconciliation** - Is celebrated on Saturday from 4:00pm to 4:45pm and in the Rectory upon request.

### Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Last Saturday, there was a Public Policy Convocation at Holy Trinity High School entitled: Lifting up Our Voices: How Catholics Can Make An Impact on Public Policy. Cardinal Dolan of New York gave a wonderful keynote address and Bishop Murphy said the Mass and homily. All of it was excellent. Telecare, our diocesan television station, will be airing this two hour special on Sunday, March 11<sup>th</sup> at 8:00pm, Tuesday, March 13<sup>th</sup> at 1:00pm and Thursday, March 15<sup>th</sup> at 9:30pm. Please make the time to watch this special. It will consist of interviews, the Cardinal's keynote address and Bishop Murphy's homily. Telecare can be seen on Cablevision channel 29/137 and Verizon FiOS 296 in addition to www.telecareTV.org or on the free APP available at the App Store.

It is very important that as Christians we be responsible citizens and register to vote now for the presidential election coming up in November. It is a gift that God has given us, the ability to vote and try to shape public policy that is in accord with our religious beliefs. In our Catholic Tradition, responsible citizenship is a virtue and participation in political life is a moral obligation. As Catholics, we should be guided more by our moral convictions than by our attachment to a political party or interest group. Even after voting, if people get into office that go directly against what we believe are Gospel values, we would have at least done our part in trying to ensure that our society lives in justice and peace. God will not judge us on the outcome of the voting. He will judge us if we choose **not** to vote and if we vote by ignoring the gospel values and vote self-ishly, by whatever benefits my own wallet or lifestyle. The Church's obligation to participate in shaping the moral character of society is a requirement of our faith, a part of the mission given to us by Jesus Christ. Faith helps us see more clearly the truth about human life and dignity that we also understand through human reason. As people of both faith and reason, Catholics are called to bring truth to political life and to practice Christ's commandment to love one another (John 13:34). Our Holy Father, Pope Benedict XVI said in his encyclical, Deus Caritas Est (God is Love), no 29, "charity must animate the entire lives of the lay faithful and therefore also their political activity, lived as 'social charity'".

Once again, I want to remind everyone that the only way we can fight against President Obama trying to take away our Freedom of Religion and Freedom of Conscience is through legislation – the creation of laws which protect our freedoms. What he is trying to do with his HHS mandate and "accommodation" is unconstitutional and affects all peoples of faith. See the bulletin flyer regarding what you can do to take action (see *Take Action Today*).

**NEW YORK STATE LEGISLATIVE ALERT:** In addition to what is happening with the HHS Mandate, there is another piece of legislation that needs our immediate attention. Governor Andrew Cuomo has let it be known in his **State of the State Address** that he will "vigorously protect a woman's right to choose and will fight for the passage of the **Reproductive Health Act**. What is the Reproductive Health Act? If passed, it will declare abortion a "fundamental right" in New York State, prohibiting even basic protections, such as parental notification, limits on government funding of abortion, and a ban on gender-selection abortions. It will allow an abortion at any time during pregnancy and allow persons other than licensed physicians to perform the procedure. For the sake of pregnant women and their unborn children, we **urge our legislators to oppose this bill**. Therefore, representatives from our Respect Life Committee are at tables in the lobby of the church today for you to sign a petition opposing this bill, which they will mail to our legislators on our behalf or you can contact the following legislators yourself:

## **Lenten Regulations**

<u>Weekdays of Lent:</u> There is no obligation to fast, however, voluntary acts of self-denial are recommended.

**Days of Abstinence:** (All Fridays in Lent) All who have reached their 14th year are bound to abstain totally from meat.

<u>Ash Wednesday & Good Friday:</u> are days of Fast and Abstinence from meat. There is a limit of (1) Full meal on these days for all between the ages of 18 and 59 inclusive.

**Easter Duty Obligation:** After receiving First Holy Communion, Catholics are bound by the obligation to receive Holy Communion at least once a year. This precept should be fulfilled during the Easter Season. Catholics are also bound to confess serious (mortal) sins at least once a year, but this is not limited to the Lenten/Easter Season.

# **Weekly Reflection**

**Remembering Jesus' story - and ours -** Lent is a time when we simplify our lives so we can focus on living out our faith. Liturgically, we journey with Jesus, whose mission we continue in our time and place, so we can see our lives in light of His. And we recognize that our spiritual growth comes through an encounter with Jesus, our brother and our model. But how do we discover what is asked of us? How do we discern God's invitations to us?

Like the disciples who accompany Jesus as He cleanses the Temple, we are students of life & seekers of truth. Through the disciples we are reminded of the importance of memory in our quest. John's gospel tells us that as they observe Jesus ejecting merchants, the disciples recall a certain relevant passage of Scripture. Similarly, after the Resurrection, they remember comments Jesus made here about raising a temple in three days. Through remembering, through recalling Jesus' words and actions, they discover meaning, relevance.

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ:

The season of Lent is an extraordinary moment of grace the Church is called to live every year in preparation for the Sacred Triduum. These Lenten weeks of prayer and fasting and works of charity are all pointed to the solemn holy days of the Thursday Mass of the Lord's Supper, the Friday of His Passion and Death on the Cross and then the exultant moments of proclaiming His Resurrection at the Easter Vigil and Easter Day.

What we will celebrate on those days shapes and informs what we seek to become by conversion, prayer and penance in the Lenten season. At the heart of the Cross of Jesus Christ is forgiveness and reconciliation. In fact the message of the Cross is the message that love, God's love for us, the Son's love in human form, that love is poured forth as the greatest act of forgiveness the world can ever know. God forgives us through His Son's death, a death that brings about the reconciliation of all humankind to God. Praised be Jesus Christ! Hail, O Cross, our only hope!

As we enter into the season of Lent with our eyes fixed on Jesus, I would like us all to pray for forgiveness of our own sins and pray for the conversion of the hearts and lives of us all so that we may belong more deeply to Christ, to His Church and to one another. As we examine our consciences and as we see ourselves in the light that shines forth from the Cross, I pray we may all receive the forgiveness that only a merciful Father can give us through His Son and through the Church. I pray that we all will seek the healing of our hearts and reconciliation with God that the Church offers through the great sacrament of merciful love, the sacrament of penance and reconciliation.

And I pray that, as we are forgiven by God, we may also forgive one another and be reconciled with one another so that, as the one Body of His Church, we may celebrate the Easter sacraments worthily and with great joy. Sister Mary Hughes, OP, Prioress of the Dominican Sisters of Amityville, wisely shared these thoughts with consecrated women: "Forgiveness never pretends that all was well...Neither does forgiving mean that one does not speak. Make no mistake. It is wrong to have so many fractured relationships in the Church and in our world". She is right! Forgiveness and reconciliation are sorely needed in our Church and in our world. If God forgives us, we too must forgive one another. You know those whom you must forgive. You know those with whom you must be reconciled. Are they in your family? In the Church? In your neighborhood? Near or far away? Now is the time for forgiveness, now is the time for salvation.

On the Cross Jesus cried out to the Father, "Forgive them". That cry was for each and every one of us. This Lent He will whisper that same cry to each one of us: "Forgive them". As He healed a fractured world and a torn humanity making us one with God and one another, I pray we too might help heal any and every fracture in our lives by imitating Him, forgiving one another from a sincere heart, and reconciling ourselves with one another so that His cross might be not only our hope but the hope for all humankind.





### NEW YORK STATE LEGISLATIVE ALERT

#### REPRODUCTIVE HEALTH ACT S.2524 (Klein)/S.2844 (Stewart-Cousins)/A.6112 (Glick)

While it is hoped that, on the federal level, the infamous Roe v. Wade decision will soon be overturned by the Supreme Court, the fact is that legal decisions regarding abortion will then just return to the sovereign states. Many of us can remember a time when New York State was known as the "Abortion Capital of the World" because it was the first state to legalize abortion and make it a big and lucrative business.

The REPRODUCTIVE HEALTH ACT will declare abortion a "fundamental right" in New York State, prohibiting even basic protections, such as parental notification, limits on government funding of abortion and a ban on gender-selection abortions. It will allow abortion at any time during pregnancy and allow persons other than licensed physicians to perform the procedure.

For the sake of pregnant women and their unborn children, we urge our legislators to oppose this bill.
