## In today's Gospel from Matthew, the Pharisees

take counsel with one another to trap and discredit Jesus, and enlist the help of the Herodians. Determination to destroy Jesus unites these two groups as they seize on the issue of the collection of a "head" tax as their common cause.

The "head" tax was one denarius, equal to the day's wage of a laborer, imposed on every man, woman and slave between 12-65 years old. It was the "price" for living in and enjoying the dubious rights of a subject of the Roman Empire. This tax was bitterly resented by the poor and nationalist Zealots, tolerated by those like the Herodians who wished to ingratiate themselves with the powerful, and resented by the Pharisees because of their opposition to the occupation of the "Land" by the Roman Gentiles.

But now integrity is eroded by expediency. Disciples of the Pharisees and the Herodians join forces and go to Jesus to spring their trap, well-oiled with insincere flattery. When Jesus is tackled about the tax issue, if he speaks out *against* it he can be charged with sedition (treason) and arrested; if he speaks *for* the tax, he will discredit himself as a prophet in the eyes of the oppressed.

Ironically, what they say to him is true: Jesus does sincerely, truthfully teach the ways of God; he has no regard for social status. But these insincere words are a lure into their trap as they ask him whether he considers it lawful or not to pay taxes to the emperor Caesar. Jesus reads the malice of their hearts, lets them know that he is not deceived by their collusion which makes it so obvious that it is not really the tax issue that is at stake, and calls them hypocrites to their faces.

Then Jesus springs his own trap. He asks them to show him the coin for the "head" tax, which bore the image of Caesar on one side and an inscription calling him "High Priest" on the other. Such accordance to the emperor of both political honor and divine status should have been abhorrent to the Jews. And in one swift move, Jesus has changed the whole issue from that of paying the tax to one of accepting images, a highly sensitive issue in Judaism.

In Jesus' hand, the coin becomes a kind of parable. Like the Pharisees, Jesus probably is not opposed to paying taxes if this is necessary for peaceful coexistence (See Matt 17:24-27), but *such an obligation is worthless when compared to the ultimate loyalty that is owed to GOD!* 

Jesus' response, in a word, to give to the emperor what is his and give to God the things that are God's, is not to be read as an explanation for the contemporary separation of church and state. Jesus does not "compartmentalize" life, and such a dualistic interpretation would have been completely contrary to his worldview. Real wisdom recognizes the legitimate function of human authority in relation to God's authority. What is demanded is that we engage in the difficult discernment of how to live in history and society and also, above all, be aware of our commitment to the reign of God. This Gospel is for all times and places.

Such an ethical task demands the action that Jesus exemplified: truthfulness rather than hypocrisy, honesty rather than flattery, justice rather than opportunism. This is still a challenge to leadership – both political and ecclesial – as well as to every Christian disciple. We might ask where is God's impression in the "coinage" of our daily life? The answer is: on everything that God has made, and especially on other women and men!

# SAINT JOHN PAUL THE GREAT

Karol Józef Wojtyla was born in the Polish town of Wadowice, a small city outside of Krakow, on May 18, 1920. He was the youngest child of Karol Wojtyla and Emilia Kaczorowska. His mother died in 1929. His eldest brother Edmund, a doctor, died in 1932 and his father, a non-

commissioned army officer died in 1941. A sister, Olga, had died before he was born.

He was baptized on June 20, 1920 in the parish church of Wadowice. Upon graduation from high school he enrolled in Krakow's Jagiellonian University in 1938 and in a school for drama. But the Nazi occupation forces closed the university in 1939 and young Karol had to work in a quarry and then in the Solvay chemical factory to earn a living.

In 1942, he began courses in the clandestine seminary of Krakow. At the same time, Karol Wojtyla was one of the pioneers of the "Rhapsodic Theatre," also clandestine.

He was ordained to the priesthood on November 1, 1946. He was elected Pope at the Conclave of October 16, 1978, and he took the name of John Paul II. On October 22, he solemnly inaugurated his Petrine ministry as the 263rd successor to the Apostle. His pontificate, one of the longest in the history of the Church, lasted nearly 27 years.

He made 104 pastoral visits outside Italy and 146 within Italy. As bishop of Rome he visited 317 of the city's 333 parishes. He had more meetings than any of his predecessors with the People of God and the leaders of Nations. More than 17,600,000 pilgrims participated in the General Audiences held on Wednesdays (more than 1160).

His love for young people brought him to establish the World Youth Days. The 19 WYDs celebrated during his pontificate brought together millions of young people from all over the world. At the same time his care for the family was expressed in the World Meetings of Families, which he initiated in 1994.

His most important Documents include 14 Encyclicals, 15 Apostolic Exhortations, 11 Apostolic Constitutions, 45 Apostolic Letters. He also published five books of his own. He added the "Luminous Mysteries" to the Rosary (mysteries that focus on the life and ministry of Christ as found in the Scriptures. He made Thérèse of the Child Jesus a Doctor of the Church; and not only canonized Saint Faustina Kowalska of Krakow, but instituted that the devotion associated with her--the Divine Mercy--be officially and especially recognized in the Church on the Sunday following Easter Sunday.

He died on April 2, 2005, at 9.37 p.m., while Saturday was drawing to a close and the Lord's Day was already beginning, the Octave of Easter and Divine Mercy Sunday. He was declared a saint on April 27th of this year-- also on Divine Mercy Sunday!



# ISIS threatens to conquer the Vatican, 'break the crosses of the infidels'

Islamic State is eying Rome as the latest installment to its self-declared caliphate, which now covers large chunks of territory in northern Iraq and Syria.

The new issue of Islamic State's English-language magazine Dabiq is out and features the Vatican on its front cover, a black flag with white Arab lettering atop the Egyptian obelisk at St. Peter's Square.

The cover story dubbed "The Failed Crusade" envisions the ancient Italian city under the rule of a Caliph and a hardline Sharia regime.

The lengthy article, which glosses the pages of the online propaganda magazine, calls on aspiring jihadists to target the Catholic Church and followers of the Christian faith.

The Islamist organization claims it will one day conquer Rome, threatening to "break [the] crosses" of infidels and sell and trade their women.

Would-be jihadist fighters and Dabiq's growing reader base are encouraged to go after every possible Crusader, their term for Westerners who oppose their advance.

Islamic State has killed and driven out large numbers of Christians and other religious groups in areas they've seized – including Shi'ite Muslims – who do not abide by their strict version of Sunni Islam.

Pope Francis, realizing the ballooning threat IS poses, has been an ardent critic of the organization, voicing his concern on multiple occasions about their prominence in the Middle East. He has called for international action to stop the group and backed the US-led coalition which has been striking Islamic State targets in recent weeks.

The newly-released fourth issue of the magazine also reiterates previous calls to attack Westerners, wherever they may be found. —*jpost.com*

# **OLGC Religious Education Spiritual Adoption Program**

Everyone loves the beauty and innocence of a baby. Remember your own children or a younger brother or sister when they were first brought home? As an expression of that love, the Religious Education Program will, once again, begin a spiritual adoption program on October 12, 2014.



OLGC's Religious Education Program will be "spiritually" adopting one child,

per class, who is newly conceived this month. All newly conceived babies should be allowed to be born and, we are going to pray for a child whose family might be in a form of "crisis". This crisis may be financial (not enough money), fear (afraid they won't be a good parent), or a single parent who is alone and scared.

We won't personally know the family or the child who we are adopting, but God will know them and make sure our prayers get to those in need.

Each class will name their child, for whom they will be praying, thereby giving that baby the humanity he or she deserves.

We are asking the Parishioners to join us in these prayers. Below is the "adoption" form that each class completes for his or her child. We ask that you take this form home and complete it as well to join your prayers with those of the OLGC classes for the next 9 months.

In addition, over the next several weeks, the child names selected by each of the classes will be posted along with the prayer that the class is saying so that you may join your prayers with the OLGC children's and raise our love and support for these unborn children to heaven.

Then, on the last day of classes for the religious education program (in May 2015), a table where parishioners may donate baby items to be given to the Sisters of Life will be set up in the Parish Hall.
