Come, Lord Jesus, Quickly Come

Notes from Pastor Hank

As we enter Advent and so begin a new church year, our thoughts turn toward Bethlehem and the mystery of Emmanuel—God with us in the infant Jesus. It is indeed a mystery to ponder, a mystery that challenges us—who live in a self-indulgent culture—to wonder what it means for us to celebrate the birth of a child who grew to be a man who had nothing and wanted nothing other than to share the love of God. What does it mean to call such a man “Lord?” What does it mean to follow such a man? What does it mean for the way we live to call this man God and to worship him? Advent invites us to ponder these questions and to examine our lives in the light of these questions. My prayer for all of us during this Advent and Christmas season is that we would all be drawn into the mystery of Emmanuel and enter the New Year more determined than ever to follow the Way of Jesus in all the places where we live and work and play. We need this—our world needs this.

Speaking about Advent and Christmas, two things to remember:

- Every Wednesday night in December, at 7:00 p.m., we will gather in the sanctuary for Advent Worship. We will be using Holden Evening Prayer—a beautiful, haunting musical setting—and I will give a short message on the meaning of Advent, expanding on the meaning of the previous Sunday’s message.
 - On December 9 and December 16, following the Wednesday night Advent Worship, I will teach a class on the two Nativity Stories in the New Testament—one which is found in the Gospel of Matthew and the other in the Gospel of Luke. Both stories are about the birth of Jesus, but the stories of his birth are very different from each other. Stick around after worship and find out how they are different and why they are different. It will be fun and informative!

We are going to be making a few major changes to our Confirmation Program next year—changes which are designed to enable us to do a far better job teaching our children what they need to know in order to understand and confirm the faith of the church. The changes will primarily concern 7th through 10th graders. Towards the end of this month, I will send a letter to these youth and their parents explaining the changes (which the Education Ministry Team and the Church Council has approved). We will then have a meeting in January with youth and parents to get their questions and feedback, and then we will provide an opportunity for the congregation as a whole to give feedback and ask questions. Stay tuned!

Christmas is a time for gift giving to those we love, to good friends and colleagues? It is also a time when many people balance their giving to family and friends with charitable giving. Such giving is truly within the Spirit of Christmas.

As we approach the end of the year, First Lutheran finds itself behind in offering both to the General Fund and the Building on Blessings Building Fund. We want our community of faith—which we all love and value—to begin the New Year in a strong financial position. If you have fallen behind in your giving, I encourage you to catch up before the end of December. If it is possible for you to make a one-time special “Christmas gift” to your church in this season of giving to help give us a solid financial foundation as we enter the New Year, it would be deeply appreciated.

2016 will be a transitional year. A new pastor will arrive, present ministries to our people and our community will continue, and new ministries will begin. It is a good time to be the church—thanks for helping to make it all happen.

Worship and Music

“It was Christmas Eve in the Austrian Alps. At the newly constructed Church of St. Nicholas in Oberndorf, a Tyrolean village near Salzburg, Father Joseph Mohr prepared for the midnight service. He was distraught because the church organ was broken, ruining prospects for that evening’s music. But Father Joseph was about to learn that our problems are God’s opportunities, that the Lord causes all things to work together for good to those who love Him. It came into Father Joseph’s mind to write a new song, one that could be sung organ-less. Hastily, he wrote the words, “Silent night, holy night, all is calm, all is bright.” Taking the text to his organist, Franz Gruber, he explained the situation and asked Franz to compose a simple tune. That night, December 24, 1818, “Silent Night” was sung for the first time as a duet accompanied by a guitar. Were it not for a broken organ, there would never have been a “Silent Night.”

Therefore the Lord Himself will give you a sign:
Behold the virgin shall conceive and bear a Son,
and shall call His name Immanuel. *Isaiah 7:14*

Call Committee Update

In early November, Brenda Tibbetts, Assistant to the Bishop, and our advocate in our search for a pastor, shared that “things were starting to shake loose” and more pastors were exploring a possible change in their call. What a true statement that has been for us! Since November 10, seven pastors have submitted their Rostered Leader Profiles (RLP) to First Lutheran.

At the time of this writing the Call Committee is reviewing the RLPs and supplemental information to ascertain our next step with each pastor. Some pastors may be a better “fit” than others and thus we turn to prayer for direction. With the Spirit’s guidance we will determine whether or not we complete an interview, review supplemental information, and contact references. And then we will pray some more to discern God’s will for us with each pastor we interview. We join in prayer with each pastor that we all might feel the touch of the Spirit.

As we go through this process, we continue to ask for your prayers and support so that we might hear God’s voice and leading. We encourage you to join us as we pray for our new pastor, unknown to us at this point. Pray for our pastor to love God, love God’s Word, and to love His people.

Your questions and comments are welcome keeping in mind we can respond to questions regarding our process but not about candidates.
