Your Turn!

In a few weeks it will again be "your turn" to help your SCRCA Board of Directors determine what programs should be included in the budget starting July 1. You have a right to expect that you will be given this opportunity and the Board has a right to expect you will attend and participate in this process.



Many of you are probably not aware that a number of our committees and staff members have been working on the 2002-03 Budget since early last fall.

The Strategic Plan Update Committee has reviewed the findings in last year's Task Force report and has recommended the preparation of a Building Master Plan as well as recom-

mending a number of other projects. (For more information on the other recommendations of the update committee, please refer to the article by Board member Dick Conzelmann in last month's "Courier".)

Members of the Golf Advisory Committee were appointed several weeks ago. As many of you know, the Committee was formed this fall to address deficiencies in the playability and maintenance of our Sun City Roseville Golf Course. Later in the budget process, specific monetary requests will be recommended to bring about the changes needed. This course is our most important asset, contributing directly to the property values of all our members.

Serious concerns regarding the care and condition of landscaping along the main traffic corridors and other parts of the common area have been reported by our Landscape Subcommittee and individual members. A pilot program is already underway along Sun City Boulevard. This project will take some time to complete because the irrigation system must be fully functional before additional plantings can take place.

The Finance Committee has been working with our new Investment Advisor to ensure that the Association is fully invested in securities providing both safety of principal and the highest interest within that constraint. Subcommittees of this standing committee have been meeting with Board representatives on drafting Budget Objectives for Board review, modification and approval. These objectives will be used to guide the Executive Director and his staff in key areas in the budget development process.

In addition to these three areas of special need, the Executive Director and his staff have been developing data regarding the money required to fund our current program of activities and events that make Sun City Roseville such a special place to live.

Departmental Budget Reviews with the Finance Committee have been scheduled as detailed below. Please note that each meeting will commence at 1:00 PM. All members of our Association are welcome to attend and are encouraged to express their views at the time reserved for resident comments.



Golf Course Maintenance

Spring is rapidly approaching and with this change in season an



entire different set of turf grass maintenance practices begins. With warmer days and nights and additional sunlight, grass slowly begins it emergence from dormancy. We encourage its growth with applications of fertilizer, light irrigation when there is not enough rainfall, chemical applications to discourage annual weeds, some overseeding or re-sodding of areas that were injured by the winter

frosts or did not recover fully from last summer's turf losses. In addition, we will begin light verti-cutting and spiking of the greens, some sand applications and just all around pampering of the turf.

This season we will be working very closely with the USGA Turf Advisory Section, local Golf Course Superintendents and the Golf

Advisory Committee to improve the overall conditioning of our golf courses. A great deal of research has been done and numerous maintenance standards have been increased to better reflect the desires of the residents of Sun City

> Roseville and the golfers that utilize our facilities. The new Maintenance Standards and Project Lists are available by calling me, Leonard Theis, 782-4450, and I will see that

you receive a copy of all the recently published information regarding increased golf course maintenance.

There will be some minor inconveniences to the golfers as some of the increased maintenance will require a part day closure of nine holes each week. The closure schedule is available in the Pro Shop and will be in addition to the twice a year closure for aerification of the greens. The greens aerification is scheduled for the Pines GC on April 4, the Oaks GC on April 15 and the Lakes GC on April 16. Aerification of the tees and fairways will also be completed during the spring but will not require the courses to be closed during those maintenance periods. We do ask for your patience as we attempt to complete these necessary maintenance activities in a timely manner.

Elections Committee

In March, it's not easy to project oneself into the heat of Summer, the 4th of July celebration, or the annual Association Election. Before you know it, they'll be here. Near the end of March, letters will be mailed to members asking good people to step forward as candidates for the Board of Directors.

Early in June, voting information and ballots will go out to members, and voting will extend from that date until July 9. There will be opportunities to meet all the candidates at the Lodge in June. The process has started.



Fitness News

Avoid the Stampede!

With over 2,200 residents using the Fitness Center on a regular basis, it is no wonder that users experience crowding of classes and



waits for the exercise machines. If you would like to work out when it is a bit less frenetic and congested, think about occasionally visiting during the less popular hours of 5:00 PM until closing. Not only will you be able to speed through your exercise program, you might also enjoy the variety of attending at a later time and having a morning free.

CPR/AED Classes

Learn how to save a life! The next CPR/AED Class will be held on April 3 from 8:30 AM-12:30 PM in the Aspen Room. Don't wait – sign-up now in the Fitness Center. The fee is only \$25 and includes your Red Cross Certification. It's easy to learn and the knowledge you gain could mean the difference between life and death for someone near and dear to you.

The Sun City Challenge!

It's time to start thinking about participating in this year's Sun City Challenge which will be held in late May (exact date TBA). You don't need to be a super athlete to take part, just enthusiastic and in reasonably good shape and health. Participants can enter one or all of the following events: 10 mile bike ride, 3.1 mile run/walk, ¼ mile swim (9 round-trip laps). Now would be the time to get yourself exercising on a regular basis so you are prepared to "meet the challenge." Remember, never begin an exercise program without the OK from your doctor especially if you suffer from any illness, disability, or disease. And once you get the go-ahead, keep in mind that the old adage "easy does it" is timeless wisdom. Ease into your fitness program to avoid muscle strains and fatigue.

FAQs (Frequently Asked Questions)-



Q- Why is the air conditioner on in the indoor pool area in the winter and early spring? I can often feel a cold draft when I'm getting in and out of the pool.

A- Actually, the air conditioner is not on. What you are feeling is the air moving due to the fans that must always be running. The thermostat is set so that the heat goes on whenever the tempera-

ture in the pool area drops below 78 degrees. Once the temperature is brought up, the heat then shuts off. The fans, however, remain on and continue to recirculate unheated air, causing it to feel like the air conditioning is on. Imagine that you had a fan in your bathroom at home and you stepped out of the shower dripping wet. The bathroom temperature may be adequate; however, if you stood in front of the fan it would cause rapid evaporation of the moisture on your skin, making you feel cold. It would be great if we didn't need to have the fans on all the time but, without them, the humidity would be so high that the walls and windows would have a buildup of condensation and the area would have a heavy chlorine smell.



Architectural Review Committee

On January 24, 2002, the Board of Directors approved new Exterior Painting Guidelines (Appendix E-1 to the Design Guidelines). These guidelines clarify and provide detail to homeowners wishing to repaint their residences.

All homeowners wishing to repaint their residences (whether or not a color change is requested) must complete and submit an application. Application forms are available in the Association Office. The forms contain detailed instructions and restrictions and should be reviewed carefully be-



If color changes are not requested, the application will be processed automatically by the ARC. (Note: no application is required for touch up painting, i.e., less than half of the house, or just the trim, or painting using the same colors and type of paint.) Color changes to the house, trim, or front doors will only be approved for colors that closely match the shades/hues on the Sun City Palettes. Please pick up a copy of the March 2002 Design Guidelines Flier for more complete details of the Exterior Painting Guidelines.



The Committee also examined photos of Sun City places and people for possible inclusion. Bouchard Marketing has received inquiries from a number of potential advertisers. The Board of Directors voted to give the participating advertisers one copy of the directory or a "read only" disk.

The directory will contain a wealth of information about Sur including a history from the time Sun City was an empty populated only by seagulls and jackrabbits to the present.

The revised "interim" Sun City Directory, to be distribute March 2002, will contain an insert giving residents the opportunity to update their directory information and also add the e-mail addresses if they wish. The resident updated information will appear in the new Community Directory scheduled for delivery October 2002.

CRC holds two meetings each month providing an open forum for all residents to participate. Both meetings are held the second Monday of the month in the Birch/Cedar Rooms. Question: Why wasn't the community asked about their opinion regarding the new Telephone Directory and that it would have 80 pages of ads given their very adamant position about wanting fewer or no ads in the *Courier*?

Answer: This directory will be significantly different from the *Courier* and will be more of a

community wide informational tool. You'll find some more info about it in this month's Community Relations Committee *Courier* article. Much like other large association directories such as Rossmoor, the Villages and Sun City Palm Desert, we hope it will serve as a "one stop shopping" directory for SCR residents. The advertisers will have a separate section for their ads - it will not interfere with the resident phone listings or the general information portion of the directory. We view the ads as being an optional service to the residents, not a detraction. At this time, I'm not sure of the exact number of pages that will wind up for ads. That will be better defined once we see how large the overall directory will be - how many informational pages, map pages, phone listing pages, etc.

Regarding the *Courier* survey, while there were residents that had issues with the advertising in the *Courier*, for the most part they recognized the need to generate revenue for it to cover costs. No viable alternatives were presented for generating that revenue. Same with the directory - the directory is to, at a minimum, break even and possibly generate some income over expenses. There is no budget for it now and the Board does not want to create one in the future. The Community Directory Sub-Committee has been meeting since last summer and meetings are open to the residents, and requests for resident participation were made when this project was first announced. Regular status updates have been given at monthly CRC meetings and the monthly Board meetings. There will also be an informational flyer on the new community directory included in the March 2002 Sun City resident telephone directory.



to a minimum. To meet this requirement, persons volunteering for the Citizen Patrol will now be subject to a periodic review of their Motor Vehicle Record. Based on the number or severity of violations and when they occurred, a volunteer may be restricted from operating any Association vehicle.



CPR/AED KNOWLEDGE SAVES LIVES

Suppose someone passes out in front of you. It could be your spouse, a family member, or perhaps a stranger. Would you know what to do? Rapid response is critical! Even a one-minute delay can be a matter of life or death.

CPR/AED classes are available now through the Fitness Center and it is extremely important that all of us take one of these—if only for our own safety. We never know when an emergency might arise and having these skills could make all the difference.

The classes are taught by Fitness Center Director Sharon Pauser and trained resident volunteers Gordon Bjonerud, Tom Schlarb, and Jeanne Dilg.

CHECK, CALL, CARE—the first thing we learn are these three trigger words. We CHECK the area for safety (live wires, fire, etc.), we CALL for help—911, or if we have a cell phone it's 786-6444, then we CARE for the victim. (We all do have this emergency number pasted on to our cell phones don't we?)

The class teaches us how to administer the Heimlich maneuver if someone is choking. We learn when to use this procedure, where to place our fist, and how to give abdominal thrusts.

We're trained in all sorts of CPR (cardiopulmonary resuscitation) techniques. We know what to do if the victim isn't breathing but shows signs of circulation. We practice how to check for heartbeats, where to place our hands in order to give chest compressions, and how to tilt the head back and clear the airway for rescue breaths. Using the dummies, we give rescue breaths. We even learn what to do if the victim is unconscious and shows no signs of breathing.

The instructors demonstrate how to use the AED (automated external defibrillator) machines. There are four of them in SCR located: (1) behind the Fitness Center Monitor's counter, (2) Monitor's Desk in the Lodge, (3) Sierra Pines, and (4) Golf Pro Shop.

We know to do CPR until the AED is ready and we find that the AED machine is simple to use. The directions are right there "on the package;" any-

one can work it. We wipe the victim's chest dry, attach the pads (one on victim's upper right chest and the other on the victim's lower left side) then let the AED analyze the victim's heart rhythm.

If the AED advises a shock is needed, push the shock button. The machine tells us what to do step-bystep.
