From Der Hayr's Desk ...

The repertory ensemble of folk artists brings historic themes of Armenian life onto the stage of today through theatricals, music and song. Members of the Troupe represent a cross-section of over three generations, born and raised in the United States. They derive their inspiration from the enduring soul of the Survivors, who are their cultural and spiritual mentors.

"THE HYE LEGION-THE GAMAVOR STORY"

The story of the *Gamavor* Movement recounts the true-life adventures of daring rescue missions during the Genocide years. At that time an alarm sounded throughout the United States: the Turks were killing Survivors and orphans while torching villages again! These selfless Gamavor men, Genocide Survivors themselves, left the safety of their homes in the U.S. and returned to Historic Armenia to search-and-rescue Survivors and orphans. They went back into the Turkish killing fields to face certain death!

Though set in the 1920's, the play's final scene ends on a hopeful note, pointing to a future of freedom and independence for Armenia. While the play is filled with intrigue, adventure and romance, it also features a dozen songs we all know and love.

The performance will be held in the Scottish Rite Masonic Center at 2115 Broad Street, Cranston. We anticipate the availability of ALMA'S GAMAVOR EXHIBIT for viewing in the Dining Hall of the Center. It is interesting to note that an impressive number of our Rhode Island Armenians were among these notable legionnaires.

Parents and invited youth must agree to the following requirements in making this reservation:


- Arrive at Sts Sahag and Mesrob Church, Egavian Hall for 8:30am on April 16.
