

Dear Community,

The Tasmanian Department of Education has spent the past few years developing a strategic plan by which its vision "...to develop successful, skilled and innovative Tasmanians" can be realised. As you would expect this includes intentional, focussed learning aimed at arming all members of the education community (and isn't that everyone?) to enact the plan. As a result I, other teachers, parents and students have been privileged to hear and work with a number of experts this year, building our understandings and stretching our thinking. On Friday I attended a Principals' Forum where leading scholar, author and speaker, Yong Zhao, challenged us to consider the implications of globalisation and technology. The way in which we met together, all DoE principals, was different to start with – rather than travelling to meet in one spot, we grouped in three regional locations – and interacted via Lync with Yong Zhao, being faced with ideas and asking questions that make personalised learning not only a possibility but a priority. Two Queechy student leaders, Fraser Rathmell and Alisha Lynch, along with four students from Kings Meadows and Prospect High Schools, also attended as another way of ensuring that today's ideas are carried forward into the future.

Similarly the workshops, and work, by Donna Cross as part of the DoE's Respectful Schools, Respectful Behaviours strategy, should have a profound and powerful impact on the health and safety of our young people. Donna Cross shared strategies and understandings re bullying, especially cyber bullying, and provoked much further questioning and thinking. One issue she highlighted was that the actions of bystanders make a critical difference - depending on how bystanders respond, they can either contribute to the problem or the solution. Some research indicates that in more than half the time bullying stops within 10 seconds of a bystander stepping in to help. When we think of bystanders and bullying most of us visualise people meeting in person but their power is just as potent via social media – "liking" a cruel, embarrassing status adds to, and compounds, the initial hurt and the ongoing suffering. One way in which we can support our children is to talk with them and think ahead about what they will do, how they will respond, when they witness or hear about bullying. We can provide examples of how helpful bystanders have shown courage and made a difference in real-life situations and in our own experiences – this allows our children to know that we understand and value behaviours which impact positively on others.

Our Interhigh Cross Country team competed on Tuesday and performed in the way we have come to expect from Queechy High School students, they did their best, encouraged and supported each other, and behaved in a manner which highlighted our values of Quality, Harmony, Success. In a field of eight local secondary schools we improved upon last year's result, achieving an overall fifth place and we congratulate all who participated but must single out Emily Heazlewood who was named the Grade 7 Girls Champion – well done, Emily!

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Teachers are finishing your child's report this week, results for the first half of the year are collated and comments written. We will now take another few weeks to ensure they are appropriately edited, read and signed by their grade leaders, read and signed by me, then printed and absence reports included. They will be ready by the end of term but we have decided to have the Admin staff place them in envelopes and then have students bring them home on Day I, Term 3– 22nd July. That way the Parent/teacher Interviews can be held the following week whilst the content and implications of the reports are still fresh in minds, allowing robust discussions and plans to take place. NextGen Team Challenge



During the week of $2^{nd} - 6^{th}$ of June, twenty four students from grades nine and ten found themselves involved in a hectic week of challenges. Students worked in a team, nominating a C.E.O, who would ensure they were on track and keeping to deadlines. The teams met up at the Maritime College at the University campus, where they were given the challenge of deciding on a Tasmanian product and then marketing it internationally.

The teams had several items to produce: a business plan, two year profit and loss statement, logistics plan, sales pitch, marketing strategy and a trade display, as well as several challenges thrown into the mix! They would have two days of lectures and challenges at the campus then have two days to complete their work back at school and to return on the last day to the campus for presentations.

All students involved found that they had to work together responsibly as a team, to complete their challenges on time and to electronically transfer documents via DropltToMe. Generally, instructions, feedback and challenges were communicated via Twitter.

As a teacher I was put in an uncomfortable position of supervisor. I could not contribute any suggestions or ideas and teams had to deal with any problems along the way by themselves. It was nerve racking for me, having to sit back and watch and not offer guidance or suggestions at all!

Psychology and Sociology Career Day

On 3rd June Keely Seaman, Stoya Taylor, Lucy Howard, Taillah Green and Caitlyn Ware represented Queechy at the psychology and sociology career day held at UTAS and Newstead College. This day was all about introducing students to behavioural studies and learning the differences between psychology and sociology. Students were given a great opportunity to update their knowledge on careers within these fields and to explore two great learning facilities in UTAS and Newstead College.

The day started at UTAS by listening to Sue Musgrave talk about the courses available within psychology and associated fields. This was a great question and answer session where information was given to students on subjects to study at college if you want to enrol in psychology/sociology, duration of courses, ATAR requirements and support structures available at UTAS for academic help.

Students were then treated to a presentation by Dr Matt Palmer, a psychology lecturer at UTAS. Here he went into detail about the differences between psychology and sociology, areas of study within these fields and conducted a few activities focusing on forensic psychology. The activities he organised were very engaging as students had to witness certain clips of crimes happening and provide information as a witness. It was interesting to see how hard it was to provide accurate information and select the correct suspect from a line up. Other activities included figuring out pattern tests and learning about why people develop phobias.

Students then listened to guest students who were studying psychology at UTAS. These presentations gave students an idea of what UTAS study load is like, the content of the courses, accommodation facilities, personal costs and how to balance university studies with work and social life.

After the UTAS session, students then returned to Newstead College to listen to Jeff O'Brien, the Newstead College sociology/psychology teacher. Here he went into detail about what to expect from these courses at a college level, what marks students should aim for to enter at a pre tertiary level and that having an open mind is important for these subjects. Students then engaged in practical tasks about what has influenced them over their life time and determining whether it was genetic or environmental. An activity was conducted about morality and students had to decide if an individual's actions were appropriate depending on the situation, this created great discussion. The last activities were about watching clips to see how much the brain actually takes in and remembers. This concept is about change blindness and is an area students will study in psychology, if you are interested in viewing these clips they are available on YouTube under "The Monkey Business Illusion" and "Experimental Psychology – Change Blindness".

This career day was run with great professionalism and really gave students an insight into what professions lie within these fields. The girls selected represented Queechy High School to the best of their ability and were given information that will allow them to make informed decisions for their first year of college. Late entries will be accepted until one (1) hour before the scheduled starting time of the particular event and must be accompanied by the late entry fee of \$20.00 (incl GST).

MARSHALLING Athletes must report to marshalling area **no later than 20 minutes** before the scheduled

start time for the event.

ATHLETE ELIGIBILITY

Athletes must be age eligible and bona fide primary or secondary school students enrolled at a government or private school/college or are engaged in approved home schooling on the day of competition. All competitors must wear their approved school athletic uniform during competition. If one is not available, competitors must wear a white singlet or top.

SCHOOL TEAMS

Three runners constitute a scoring school team. There is no requirement to pre-nominate the three runners who make up a school's team(s). If there are more than three runners in any event from any one school, the school's first three runners to finish will constitute the first team, the next three runners from that school, the second team from that school, and so on. To make up a team, all runners must be from the same school. Composite teams are not permitted.

NB: Age of competitors will be taken as at 31 December 2014. In order to compete in this competition, athletes must be born between 1995 and 2002 inclusive.

MEDALS / AWARDS

Gold, silver and bronze championship medals will be awarded to the first three individual place-getters in each event. There will also be a teams' championship in each event with medals being awarded to the first three school teams to finish. For teams only, three medals will be given to the team. Some delay can occur with team results and medal presentations will not therefore be made on the day in these categories.


