Hillsborough Junior College (HJC) opened its doors in the fall of 1968 to serve the residents of Hillsborough County on the west coast of Florida with a population of almost 1,300,000 including its largest city, Tampa. The college applied for accreditation as a candidate institution in 1969 and was accredited by the Commission on Colleges of the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools in 1971. The first permanent campus, located on Dale Mabry Highway – a major north/south artery for the county – was established in 1970. The college's Board of Trustees changed the college's name to Hillsborough Community College (HCC) on December 9, 1970, to more accurately reflect its philosophy and mission.

The college experienced rapid growth and change in the following decades, adding the Ybor City and Plant City campuses in the 1970s and the Brandon Campus in 1989. A corporate training center, established in 1998, is located on the grounds of the District Administrative Offices on Davis Islands, near downtown Tampa.

Since the last reaffirmation of accreditation in 2007, HCC was approved via Substantive Change to offer instruction at three additional locations. A fifth campus, called SouthShore, was opened in 2008 in Ruskin. In 2013, HCC received approval to offer dual enrollment coursework leading to the Associate in Arts degree at Armwood and Leto High Schools as "Collegiate Academies."

Since July 2011, Dr. Ken Atwater has served as HCC's seventh president. Each of the five campuses has a campus president who reports directly to the college president. The institution is governed by a local Board of Trustees consisting of five members appointed by the governor and approved by the Florida senate. The mission of HCC, most recently approved in 2012, states: *Hillsborough Community College delivers teaching and learning opportunities that empower students to achieve their educational*

goals and become contributing members of the local community and a global society. The college is currently in the final stages of a comprehensive review of its college goals and strategic initiatives slated for adoption by the Board of Trustees in October 2014.

Hillsborough County is home to a number of postsecondary institutions including the University of South Florida (public) and the University of Tampa (private). Major employers include the Hillsborough County government and school system, the University of South Florida, MacDill Air Force Base, Verizon Communications, Busch Gardens, Tampa International Airport, and several large hospitals and banking enterprises.

In 2013-14, the college served almost 45,000 (unduplicated) credit and non-credit students who generated over 20,000 FTE including 1,300 students enrolled solely in "recreation and leisure" courses offered across the county. Approximately 85% of the students were enrolled in credit courses; an additional 12% were enrolled in non-credit courses. Among the students seeking workforce credentials, two-thirds of the enrollment is to prepare students for health care and public service occupations. Overall, 57.6% of the students are aged 25 or younger (mean age = 27.1; median = 23.3). Fifty-five percent of the students are female. In 2009, non-White students became the majority; in 2013-14, non-White students made up 54% of the student population (27% Hispanic, 21% Black, 6% Asian and Other). Thirty-nine percent of the student population is enrolled on a full-time basis.

HCC has an open-door admissions policy requiring, in general, a high school diploma or its equivalent.

Hillsborough Community College offers Associate in Arts (AA) and Associate in Science (AS) degrees as well as certificates and diplomas. In 2013, HCC received Substantive Change approval for the closure of all Associate in Applied Science (AAS) degrees. Though discontinued, the programs still graduate students as part of their close-out. The following list of credentials are those offered as college credit. Non-credit is not reflected. Graduates are for the 2013-14 reporting year (summer 2013, fall 2013, and spring 2014).

Hillsborough Community College participated in a state-wide Substantive Change initiative for the expansion of distance learning during 2000, resulting in SACSCOC approval granted in 2001. Distance education credit courses are offered in a large array of general education and technical courses leading towards a degree. The entire General Education core can be delivered via distance education. Programs offered that can be completed online include the Associate of Arts; Associate of Science degrees in Criminology, Criminal Justice, Optical Management, and Opticianry Dispensing. These offerings primarily serve students residing in Hillsborough County using asynchronous technology. Distance education is not being used for program delivery at a specific site.
