Use the outline attached to write a first copy before writing your good copy on the snowman parts. Make sure you've edited for spelling, capitals and punctuation. Follow the RUBRIC provided to guide you with your first copy.

Remember to write using complete sentences. Edit before you write on the snowman parts. Be creative and show lots of TLC... TENDER, LOVING, Care!

## Outline of Snowman

Hat

- Draw a picture that goes with the story and write a sentence to explain your picture.

Face

- Decorate as you wish

Nose

- Book title
- Author
- Your name

Body

- Plot- What is your book about? What problem needs to be solved? (minimum 5 sentences)

Bottom

- Resolution- how does the story end? How does the problem get solved? (Minimum 5 sentences)

Right Arm

- Character- who is your main character? Describe their personality and appearance.

Left Arm

- Setting- where does your story take place? Describe it. (minimum 2 sentences)

Scarf

- Recommendation. Explain if you liked or disliked the book and why. Rate it out of 10. Who you would recommend it to?
